The TSA share is calculated utilizing 25 the current number of authorized teams (4) at \$50,500 per team. Only funding for 26 the base year of performance is provided at the time of the OTA award. Funding for 27 years two (2) through five (5) will be provided via OTA modification on an annual 28 29 basis; and 30 WHEREAS, the Sheriff agrees to maintain the ability to promptly respond to 31 threats at support facilities within the Sheriff's Transportation Operating System 32 (TOS), which affect public safety or transportation operations; and 33 34 WHEREAS, the Sheriff agrees that TSA canine teams will conduct frequent 35 canine activities within view of the public, thereby providing a noticeable visible 36 deterrent towards terrorist threats and other criminal activity; and 37 38 39 WHEREAS, the Sheriff agrees that the TSA-certified canine teams will be utilized at least eighty percent (80%) of their time in the Sheriff's TOS (General 40 Mitchell International Airport); and 41 42 WHEREAS, the TSA will provide trained canines as quickly as possible, 43 depending upon available resources and mission objectives; and 44 45 WHEREAS, the Sheriff agrees to maintain a minimum of three (3) TSA-46 47 certified explosive detection canine teams; and 48

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- WHEREAS, the Sheriff will provide handler candidates to attend the TSA canine/handler training. The required retention period for all canine handlers in the NEDCTP is a minimum of three (3) years; and
- WHEREAS, the Sheriff agrees to submit a complete and accurate reimbursement package detailing all monthly expenditures regardless of the availability of funds to the FCC, no later than thirty (30) days after the submission month. The TSA will reimburse the Sheriff for amounts expended on authorized reimbursable items; and
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- 59 WHEREAS, the Sheriff is required to send one representative to a scheduled 60 NEDCTP Program Review; now, therefore,
- BE IT RESOLVED, the Office of the Sheriff is hereby authorized to apply for
 and accept Department of Homeland Security Transportation Security Administration
 National Explosives Detection Canine Team Program grant for funding TSA certified
 explosives detection canine teams to respond to threats at General Mitchell
 International Airport and related locations within the Office of the Sheriff's
 Transportation Operating System (TSO) in the amount of \$1,010,000.
