Retroactive Authorization to Apply for Transportation Alternatives Program Grants - ACTION

#### **Policy**

Parks requests retroactive authorization to apply for up to 4 Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grants.

#### Background

TAP is a State of Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) program for the administration of federal transportation funds. The focus of TAP is on bicycle and pedestrian facilities that will serve at least some utilitarian trips—such as commuting to work or school—that might otherwise be made by automobile. Examples of eligible TAP infrastructure projects include sidewalks, pedestrian amenities and wayfinding, shared use paths and trails for transportation purposes, bike lanes, bike parking, bike racks on buses, bike share systems (capital costs, not operating costs), and infrastructure to improve safety for pedestrians and bicyclists. Projects awarded funding the last round include: Historic Lake Park Ravine Bridge Replacement, Little Menomonee River Parkway Oak Leaf Trail Relocation, Greenfield Park Oak Leaf Trail Reconstruction.

TAP projects are funded on an 80% federal/20% local cost-share basis. WisDOT operates TAP as a reimbursement program that requires local entities to finance the project. WisDOT reimburses project sponsors for the federal share of 80% of the approved project cost up to the limit of the award.

Milwaukee County Parks is continuing to refine the budgets and project details so estimated costs and limits may be adjusted to best meet grant requirements and increase likelihood of funding.
