21 funds must be spent outside the City of Milwaukee; and
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23 WHEREAS, the County has a surplus of funding from previous years due to the
24 Coronavirus Disease, supply chain issues, and other factors; and
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26 WHEREAS, the Housing Division, Department of Health and Human Services,
27 staff contacted all current grantees regarding the ability of additional funds for projects
28 that could be invoiced prior to October 1, 2022; and
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30 WHEREAS, all grantees with eligible projects are being awarded requested
31 funding; and
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33 WHEREAS, Scott Crawford, Inc., will also be awarded funds for the development
34 of affordable housing in South Milwaukee; and
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36 WHEREAS, the Committee on Community, Environment, and Economic
37 Development, at its meeting of September 12, 2022, recommended adoption of
38 File No. 22-948 (vote 4-0); now, therefore,
