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WHEREAS, current domestic violence practices proved inadequate to support victims in recent high-profile cases and may even bear a part in the fatalities, which

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WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance has a comprehensive domestic violence training guide; and

WHEREAS, media reports have indicated that while the State of Wisconsin has some of the most comprehensive domestic violence laws on the books, including a mandatory arrest law, that the laws are often not enforced; and

WHEREAS, it is important that State leaders evaluate current State Statutes for both their content and effectiveness, and identify ways in which current law can be clarified and/or strengthened; and

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin has an abundance of resources, including Wisconsin Coalition Against Domestic Violence, and several other community partners and stakeholders to provide resources in support of strengthening the response to domestic violence incidents; and

WHEREAS, a task force of representatives, including representatives from all aspects of both the criminal justice and social service community, including local law enforcement officers, should be convened to examine current practice, and bring forth recommendations for best practices in responding to domestic violence incidents; now, therefore.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby requests that the State of Wisconsin develops a task force to review current state domestic violence laws, evaluate the extent to which current laws are implemented, and identify ways in which the State law can be strengthened; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Clerk shall forward a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Attorney General, and members of the Milwaukee County Delegation in the State Legislature.
