The district attorney is requesting permission from the County Board, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 59.52(31)(c) and section 56.30(4)(b) of the county general ordinances, to enter into a three-and-a-half-year contract of approximately \$356,500 with the Sojourner Family Peace Center, Inc. (Sojourner), from approximately July 1, 2017, to December 31, 2020, to continue a federal domestic violence grant project.

Since 2006, the U.S. Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women (OVW), has provided grant funding, under the Grants to Encourage Arrests and Enforcement of Protection Orders (GTEA) program, to Milwaukee County to promote victim safety and enhance prosecution in domestic violence cases. Sojourner is the district attorney's community partner in the project. The County Board first authorized the district attorney to contract with Sojourner to implement the project in file number 06-442, December 14, 2006, and contractual payments to Sojourner have been included in the district attorney's budgets from 2007 to 2017.

In September 2016, OVW made a GTEA grant award of \$900,000 to Milwaukee County, in collaboration with Sojourner, the county's non-profit, non-governmental victim service provider, to promote victim safety and enhance the prosecution of domestic violence cases. The grant provides approximately three additional years of funding for two prosecutors in the district attorney's domestic violence unit and for two Sojourner victim advocates, at a budgeted cost of \$336,513 for the advocates' salaries and fringe benefits, to provide services in Milwaukee police district stations to victims of domestic violence.

The existing contract with Sojourner, which was approved by the County Board on December 19, 2013, file number 13-850, ends on June 30, 2017. However, the current GTEA grant has been extended to September 30, 2017, and we estimate that funding of approximately \$15,000 to \$20,000 for Sojourner will

remain on the current grant as of July 1, 2017. Therefore, we are requesting permission to enter into a contract of approximately \$356,500 with Sojourner, assuming grant funds are available, consisting of approximately \$15,000 to \$20,000 remaining on the current GTEA grant as of July 1, 2017, and approximately \$336,513 on the new GTEA grant award made in September 2016.

The proposed 2017-20 contract with Sojourner has been approved in DocuSign by Community Business Development Partners (CBDP), Risk Management, Corporation Counsel as to form, Comptroller, and the County Executive. We will resubmit the contract in DocuSign for the Corporation Counsel's second signature after County Board approval.

The OVW GTEA domestic violence grant requires no local match, and the contractual payments to Sojourner have no tax levy effect because the payments are offset entirely by federal revenue. Estimated 2017 contractual payments to Sojourner and offsetting federal revenue are included in the district attorney's adopted 2017 budget, and 2018 contractual payments to Sojourner and offsetting revenue will be included in the district attorney's 2018 budget submission.
