requesting an audit of the Milwaukee County Behavioral Health Services Division

A RESOLUTION

regarding statutory notification requirements under Wisconsin Statutes Statute Chapter 971 – Competency Proceedings related to the discharge of individuals from inpatient treatment facilities

WHEREAS, the health and safety of all Milwaukee County residents is a top priority of the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, a recent incident widely reported in the media involved the release of an individual with mental illness from an inpatient treatment facility without proper notification to required entities, including the criminal court of jurisdiction, the district attorney, and the individual's attorney of record, as required under Wis. Stat. § 971.14(6)(c); and

WHEREAS, the individual in question had previously been charged with first-degree intentional homicide in 2019 but was found not legally competent to stand trial and not likely to regain legal competency within the statutory timeframe; and

WHEREAS, as a result, the individual's criminal case was suspended, and he was ordered to undergo civil commitment proceedings under Wis. Stat. Chapter 51 and transferred to a Milwaukee County reception hospital; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. Chapter 51 – State Alcohol, Drug Abuse, Developmental Disabilities and Mental Health Act governs civil commitments and is separate and distinct from criminal proceedings; and

WHEREAS, following a community incident in June 2025, it was revealed that the individual had been living in a group home for the past two years, raising concerns that the statutory notification requirements under Wis. Stat. § 971.14(6)(c) were not followed when he was discharged from the inpatient facility; and

WHEREAS, in a subsequent court proceeding on June 23, 2025, a judge ordered a new competency examination, and the Milwaukee County District Attorney's office indicated it would consider pursuing criminal charges if the individual is found competent; and

WHEREAS, on June 26, 2025, the Milwaukee County Behavioral Health Services Division acknowledged a communication oversight and committed to working with the District Attorney's Office to ensure future compliance with applicable state laws; and

WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors seeks the assistance of the County's Audit Services Division to determine whether this incident was isolated or indicative of broader issues, and to assess whether improvements to current policies and procedures are needed to ensure compliance with state statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Audit, at its meeting of July 7, 2025, recommended adoption of File No. 25-480 (vote 6-0); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors requests the Milwaukee County Audit Services Division to conduct an audit of Milwaukee County Behavioral Health Services Division, specifically to review its policies, procedures, and compliance with notification requirements under Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 971 related to the discharge of individuals from inpatient treatment facilities.
