**1. To amend the resolution beginning on line 37 as follows:**

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Parks, Recreation and Culture shall submit a written report defining and identifying “high crime-volume park areas” and providing comparative information on the cost, efficacy, and current usage level of other public surveillance programs utilized in the last 10 years in the Metro-Milwaukee area, and submitting on the status of the cost-benefit analysis results to the Committee on Parks, Energy and Environment for the ~~September 2014~~ January 2015 cycle; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the results from the cost-benefit analysis show that installing and operating surveillance cameras in County parks would are found to be the most advantageous option in preventing crime in Milwaukee County’s parks, and would do so without simply diverting crime to other areas of surrounding neighborhoods, the Department of Parks, Recreation and Culture shall pursue measures to develop a plan for installing surveillance cameras within high crime-volume park areas, subject to County Board approval.
