From the Director, Department on Aging, requesting authorization to execute Program and Service Contracts with: Legal Action of Wisconsin, Inc., in the amount of \$376,714; United Community Center, Inc., in the amount of \$373,189; Unison in the total amount of \$1,875,348; Goodwill Industries of Southeastern Wisconsin, Inc., in the amount of \$1,162,903; Able Access Transportation, Inc., in the amount of \$1,410,460; and Serving Older Adults, Inc., in the amount of \$450,000 for supportive social services and community programs serving Milwaukee County seniors age 60 or older, for the period effective January 1, 2019, through December 31, 2019, by recommending adoption of the following:

AN ENGROSSED RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the 2019 Adopted Budget for the Department on Aging (the Department) allocated revenues and expenditures for the purchase of a variety of supportive services and community programs for Milwaukee County (the County) older persons; and

WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Commission on Aging (the Commission) was created by Chapter 53 of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances as the designated Area Agency on Aging for the County under the Older Americans Act; and

WHEREAS, consistent with Section 59.52(31)(c), Wisconsin State Statutes, the Department must, on behalf of the Commission, bring contracts of \$300,000 or more to the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County Board) for authorization; and

WHEREAS, the following vendors performed satisfactorily under prior contracts, and with sufficient funds included in the Department's 2019 Adopted Budget, the Department and Commission recommend awarding the following contracts for the period effective January 1, 2019, through December 31, 2019:

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WHEREAS, as reported by the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel, the Chief Executive 137 Officer (CEO) of UNISON, Inc., was arrested on November 20, 2018, and based on a 138 search warrant by Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office, an investigation found probable 139 cause that the CEO had committed theft by fraud by taking County grant money for 140 computers that were never purchased; and 141 142 WHEREAS, the fraud investigation involving the former CEO of UNISON, Inc., 143 casts serious doubt on the ability of the organization to provide effective services to 144 seniors; and 145 146 147 WHEREAS, at its meeting on December 6, 2018, the Committee on Finance and Audit considered, but failed to adopt, an amendment that would reject the proposed 148 contracts with UNISON, Inc., and instead pursue providing these services through other 149 contractual staff, agencies, or with County employees; and 150 151 WHEREAS, the Department's testimony to the Committee on Finance and Audit 152 highlighted their supplemental report dated December 4, 2018, (attached to file) that 153 would change all proposed 2019 UNISON, Inc., annual contracts to month-to-month 154 and said "It is our belief that, at this time, moving forward with UNISON contracts is the 155 156 only way to avoid a disruption of services to the older adults in Milwaukee County"; and 157 WHEREAS, on December 5, 2018, a day prior to the Department's testimony to 158 the Committee on Finance and Audit, the Department provided a "Notification of non-159 compliance of contract agreement with the Department on Aging" to the CEO of 160 UNISON, Inc., but did not report their action to policymakers during a lengthy discussion 161 of UNISON, Inc.'s performance and ability to provide quality services going forward; and 162 163 WHEREAS, in an email to the County Board on December 11, 2018, the 164 Department shared a draft audit provided by UNISON, Inc., three days earlier that 165 further details the deficiencies related to the ongoing investigation and the Director 166 concluded, "Given the gravity of the situation, I am recommending that we not move 167 forward with any UNISON contracts"; and 168 169 WHEREAS, in October 2018, the Department entered into a Purchase of Service 170 Contract with Wisconsin Policy Forum, Inc., in the amount of \$15,600, "to research the 171 future of Senior Centers in Milwaukee County"; and 172 173 WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance and Audit, at its meeting of December 6, 174 175 2018, recommended adoption of File No. 18-897 (vote 7-0); now, therefore, 176 BE IT RESOLVED, the Director, Department on Aging (the Department), is 177 178 hereby authorized to enter into contracts for 2019 with the above-named providers and 179 for the programs, services, and award amounts indicated.; and

180 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Department is authorized and directed to use 181 the \$1,875,348 in funding that has been provided to the Department in the 2019 182 Adopted Budget for Family Caregiver Support and Alzheimer's Disease Direct services. 183 Washington, McGovern, and Wilson Senior Centers services, Meal Site Supervision. 184 and Coordination of Neighborhood Services to procure or contract for these services 185 from another provider or directly provide the services; and 186 187 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, it is the policy of Milwaukee County (the County) 188 that these services not be provided by UNISON, Inc., in 2019 unless authorized by a 189 subsequent action by the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County Board); and 190 191 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Department of Human Resources, working in 192 conjunction with the Department, is authorized to create comparable County positions, if 193 194 needed, for the purposes of providing the aforementioned services and shall submit the new position creates to the County Board for approval as soon as practical; and 195 196 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Department can hire temporary staff, 197 including individuals that may already be providing the services to seniors, with the 198 199 funds that have been allocated to the Department; and 200 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Department shall provide monthly updates to 201 the County Board on the progress to replace UNISON, Inc., as the provider of the 202 services outlined in this resolution to ensure the delivery of high-quality services to 203 204 seniors with minimal disruption. 205 206 207 kae 208 209 S:\County Board Files\County Board 2018\Engrossed Resolutions & Ordinances\December 13\18-897 Aging 210 Program and Service Contracts.doc
