Report from the Director, Office of Strategy, Budget, and Performance, requesting allocation of \$9,103,671 in Opioid Settlement Funds to support recommended projects in FY26-FY2, by recommending adoption of the following:

A RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County (the County) has among the highest rates of overdose deaths in the State of Wisconsin (the State), and record numbers of emergency calls related to overdoses have been seen in the last two years; and

WHEREAS, according to the County's Overdose Dashboard, in 2024, the opioid overdose fatality rate in the County was 47.4 per 100,000 persons, down from 71.0 per 100,000 in 2022; and

WHEREAS, in adopted File No. 17-722, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County Board) authorized the Office of Corporation Counsel (OCC) to retain outside counsel under a contingency-fee arrangement, and to file a lawsuit against opioid manufacturers and distributors, as the OCC deemed appropriate; and

WHEREAS, 2021 Wisconsin Act 57 created Section 165.12, Wisconsin State Statutes (State Statutes), relating to the settlement of all or part of the litigation; and

WHEREAS, Section 165.12(4)(b)2, State Statutes, provides that the proceeds from the Settlement Agreement (the Agreement) must be deposited in a segregated account, known as the Opioid Abatement Account (the Account), and may be expended only for approved uses for opioid abatement, as provided in the Agreements; and

WHEREAS, the County Board adopted File Nos. 21-1127 and 23-490, which authorized OCC to enter into the Agreements to receive funds from three Opioid Settlement Distributors and five pharmacies, and the settlements resulted in an approximate net amount of \$111 million paid to the County over the next 18 years; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the Comptroller projects that the County will receive approximately \$53 million in Opioid Settlement Agreement funding through 2028, based on a disbursement schedule provided by advisors:

WHEREAS, adopted File No. 21-1127 called for the establishment of a segregated Account that is not part of the General Fund, and any unused funds that remain at the end of the year will be carried over to the new year; and

WHEREAS, the Project Management Office, Office of Strategy, Budget, and Performance, gathered input from County stakeholders and facilitated a process to make allocation recommendations for the Opioid Settlement Funds; and

WHEREAS, County departments submitted proposals for projects that include one-time expenses, such as equipment, technology or capital items, or programmatic expenses; and

WHEREAS, Opioid Settlement Funds allocations requested in this file (cohort 3) are planned to be expended in years 2026, 2027, and 2028; and

WHEREAS, projects are recommended for County Board authorization after a panel reviewed and scored the project proposal reflected in Table B; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board hereby authorizes the administering departments, OSBP, the Office of Corporation Counsel, Risk Management, Department of Administrative Services (DAS), the Office of Economic Inclusion, DAS, the Comptroller, and the County Executive, to prepare, review, approve, and execute all contracts and other documents, and take all actions as required, to administer the above-referenced projects funded by the Fund.

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
