SUMMARY OF PROPOSED WORK

1. At the request of Milwaukee County Parks, two AutoCAD drawings have been prepared to address the future work proposed on the northwest baseball diamond at Center Street Park. One drawing addresses the required grading and the other outlines the proposed field dimensions.
2. Grading beyond the limits of the infield is required for two reasons: 1) the condition of the current outfield is unplayable for safety reasons, and 2) there is a berm around the infield limits that needs to be removed so the infield can be blended to match the surrounding grade. As it is now, the field is not safe for play in either the infield or the outfield. Two photos of the current infield are included here.



The grading work proposed in the outfield will simply smooth the existing topsoil in left and center fields. In right field, reshaping of the existing topsoil will enhance drainage toward an existing storm manhole south of the proposed grading limit. Silt fence will be placed 5 foot outside the grading limits around the entire site. Straw bales or waddles will be used in the drainage swale along our south grading limit. Type A inlet protection will be constructed around the existing storm manhole.
