12 13	The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Milwaukee does ordain as follows:
14 15	SECTION 1. Chapter 19 of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is amended as follows:
16	19.01 Fingerprinting required; information required.
17	All employees in positions that are required by law to be fingerprinted, and
18	any other position so designated by the Director of the Department of Human
19	Resources, shall have their Ffingerprints of all officers and of all persons in the
20	employ of the county and any of its boards or commissions, whether with or
21	without pay, shall be taken by the Office of the Sheriff on forms prescribed by the
22	Office of the Sheriff, within the first five (5) days of the commencement of
23	employmentstandard eight-inch by eight-inch fingerprint cards, together with
24	such information as full name of person fingerprinted, race, sex, date fingerprint
25	impression is taken, applicant's signature, name of department employing, city,
26	state, position held or applied for, date, address, birthplace, age, date of birth,
27	height, weight, color of hair and eyes, complexion, build, scars and marks, and
28	such other information, including photograph, and proof of citizenship, as the
29	county department of human resources may require Such fingerprint record shall
30	be retained by the Office of the Sheriff.
31	19.02 New entrants to county service.
32	The department of human resources, or in the case of exempt employes,
33	the heads of departments, are ordered and directed to secure such fingerprints
34	and other information initially before March 1, 1942, and to obtain the fingerprints
35	of all future entrants and officials when they enter the service of the county, as
36	indicated in section 19.01 of the Code.
37	19.03 Records of fingerprints.
38	One (1) copy of such fingerprints shall be taken by the sheriff's department
39	in the prescribed manner, under the direction of the department of human

40	resources. Such fingerprint record shall be retained in the files of the sheriff's
41	department. The department of human resources shall check payrolls and shall
42	notify all persons omitting to file prints.
43	19.04 Record given to employe upon termination of employment.
44	Persons as prescribed in section 19.01 of the Code, shall, upon their
45	request, be furnished their fingerprint record sixty (60) calendar days after their
46	termination of employment with the county. However, if such persons return to
47	the employ of the county, their fingerprints shall again be taken as prescribed in
48	sections 19.01, 19.02 and 19.03 of the Code.
49	19. 05 02 Effect of noncompliance with chapter.
50	Any person refusing to comply with this chapter, shall not be employed, or
51	if employed shall be subject to dismissal from the county service.

53	SECTION 2. The provisions of this ordinance shall be effective upon passage and
54	publication.
