1 By Supervisors Nicholson, O'Connor, Johnson, Jr., File No. 25-705 2 Bielinski, Taylor (5), Martin, Gómez-Tom, Capriolo. 3 Shea, Vincent, Martinez, Coggs-Jones, and Rolland 4 5 6 7 A RESOLUTION 8 9 Declaring food apartheid a public health emergency in Milwaukee County and directing 10 County action to address food insecurity during the Federal government shutdown 11 12 13 WHEREAS, on October 31, 2025, Governor Tony Evers declared a State 14 of Emergency in response to the ongoing federal government shutdown, which 15 has jeopardized access to vital programs that safeguard the health, safety, and 16 economic security of Wisconsin residents; and 17 18 WHEREAS, these programs include FoodShare benefits, Head Start 19 services, and affordable healthcare, and their impairment threatens food security, 20 family stability, and local economies; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the disruption of critical federal programs includes the 23 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), which helps nearly 700,000 24 Wisconsin residents, including families, seniors, and children, afford nutritious 25 food; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the potential loss of SNAP benefits has heightened concerns 28 about food insecurity and limited access to affordable, healthy, and culturally 29 appropriate food options in many Milwaukee County neighborhoods; and 30 31 WHEREAS, on May 20, 2019, the Milwaukee County Board of 32 Supervisors declared racism a public health crisis and committed to embedding 33 racial equity into all County budgeting, policymaking, and service delivery; and 34 35 WHEREAS, food apartheid describes the deliberate, racialized systems of 36 disinvestment and market practices that restrict access to nutritious, affordable, 37 and culturally relevant food in communities of color; and 38 39 WHEREAS, the closure of grocery stores and pharmacies has 40 disproportionately impacted Black, Latino, and low-income residents of 41 Milwaukee County, worsening inequities in diet-related diseases, infant mortality,

life expectancy, and medication access; and

WHEREAS, in the Metcalfe Park neighborhood, more than 40 percent of residents live in poverty and more than one in four households lack access to a car, forcing many seniors and families to rely on public transportation or shared rides to reach grocery stores and pharmacies in other neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, Metcalfe Park, a historically Black community in Milwaukee County, is experiencing food apartheid following the July 2025 closure of the area's only full-service grocery store, further limiting access to nutritious and affordable food; and

described Metcalfe Park's conditions as an example of food apartheid, emphasizing that this crisis arises from structural inequities rather than natural scarcity; and

WHEREAS, local leaders, news outlets, and public health advocates have

WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance-Budget, at its special meeting of November 6, 2025, recommended adoption of File No. 25-705 (vote 7-0); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors declares food apartheid to be a public health emergency in Milwaukee County, a condition further exacerbated by the ongoing federal government shutdown and acutely affecting neighborhoods such as Metcalfe Park; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors requests the Office of Equity, in coordination with the Department of Health and Human Services, to incorporate measures of food apartheid and related disparities into the County's racial equity budget tool; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Health and Human Services and the Office of Equity are requested to collaborate with state, municipal, and community partners to identify strategies and potential interventions to address food apartheid in Milwaukee County, beginning with Metcalfe Park; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Health and Human Services and the Office of Equity shall provide a report to the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors during the March 2026 committee cycle with recommended actions and policy options for addressing food apartheid in Milwaukee County.
