REQUEST

From the Chief Deputy, Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office, requesting approval of amendment # 4 to Milwaukee County's agreement with the Inmate Calling Solutions LLC (ICSolutions) for correctional communication services to act in accordance with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) order FCC 25-75A1: 2025 IPCS (Incarcerated People's Communications Services) Implementation of the Martha Wright-Reed Act, Adopted October 28, 2025

BACKGROUND

On July 28, 2024, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) voted to implement several new regulations on phone and video call services in prisons and jails. As required by the 2022 Martha Wright-Reed Fair and Just Communications Act, the FCC laid out new price caps that prisons, jails and their telecom providers must abide by, lowering the existing caps set in 2021. The new FCC ruling FCC 24-75 set the cap for phone calls at \$.06 per minute and set the first-rate cap for video calling at \$.11 per minute for jails and prisons the size of the Milwaukee County Jail (MCJ) and the Community Reintegration Center (CRC).

Per the agreement with ICSolutions and Milwaukee County, the implementation of these new rate caps would constitute a material change to comply with the FCC ruling and would allow for a good-faith negotiation of an amendment to the agreement.

6c(iii) FCC or Other Regulatory Body Rules or Policies

Should an additional material change in the rules or policies of the FCC or other regulatory body applicable to resident communication services occur following the execution of the Agreement, which such change negatively affects (a) the calling rates and/or fees permitted to be charged by the Contractor to residents under the Agreement; (b) the right of the County to recover its costs; or (c) the ability for Contractor to pay to the County a revenue share, fees (including but not limited to the Cost Recoupment Payment) or other cost recovery mechanisms, then the Contractor and the County will negotiate in good faith an amendment to this Agreement that enables both parties to recover costs in a manner compliant with the change in the FCC's (or other regulatory body's) rules or policies.

In the 2024 adopted budget, the County Executive proposed a program that would provide up to 390 minutes of free phone calls and 60 minutes of video visitation minutes per month at both the Milwaukee County Jail (MCJ) and the Community Reintegration Center (CRC). All phone revenue had been eliminated to offer residents free minutes for both phone and video visits. This program intended to make phone calls more accessible and allow residents to reach loved ones without the financial burden placed on those closest to them.

The Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office convened a cross-departmental workgroup to implement free calling in both correctional facilities. This group included members from the Sheriff's Office, the Community Reintegration Center, Procurement, IMSD, and a project manager from the Office of Strategy Budget and Performance. This workgroup met weekly beginning in early 2024 to implement free calling and to address any potential technology or equity issues. This group also partnered with the Budget Office and County leadership to review proposals from the vendor and the impact of the FCC ruling on the County's ability to maintain free calling.

Milwaukee County and ICSolutions were in a trial period of implementing free phone call and video visitation minutes when the FCC ruling was adopted. Initially, the proceeds from phone calls and video visits that the county received would fund the free minutes. The new FCC ruling eliminated this funding with only commissions on tablet usage remaining.

FCC-24-75 prohibited Incarcerated People's Communications Services ("IPCS") providers from charging facilities, incarcerated persons, and the loved ones of incarcerated persons additional charges such as ancillary fees and special fees added to the base cost of calls.

FCC-24-75 restricted IPCS providers from providing "Site Commissions", including in-kind payments, infrastructure investments, or other valuable goods and services to correctional facilities. IPCS providers may reimburse correctional facilities for actual expenses related to the provision of communications services, provided those expenses meet the order's definition of "used and useful".

Funding fees when friends and family members deposit funds into their loved one's prepaid communications account were eliminated with the FCC ruling.

The FCC ruling required new rates and other changes to become effective November 19, 2024. The FCC permitted contracts currently in-force to continue until either the term of the contract expired, or the contract was amended, in which event the new rates and other changes were to come into effect immediately. The Parties mutually agreed that the requirements of FCC 24-75 would become effective March 30, 2025, and impact any future contract(s) between the Parties.

On June 30, 2025, the Wireline Competition Bureau ("WCB") released the 2025 IPCS Waiver Order which temporarily extended the deadlines by which IPCS Providers, including the Contractor, must comply with the rate cap, site commission, and per-minute pricing rules adopted in the 2024 IPCS order until April 1, 2027, "...or any alternative date the Commission sets as part of further action in the IPCS proceeding in order to "preserve" correctional officials' ability to provide safe and secure access to IPCS while the Commission considers reevaluating aspects of the *2024 IPCS Order*.

Per a new FCC order, DA 25-565, the Milwaukee County could collect commissions on phone calls and video visitation. The new rates for phone calls went from \$0.06 per minute to \$.16 per minute and the new rate for video calling went from \$0.11 per minute to \$.25 per minute for jails and prisons the size of the Milwaukee County Jail (MCJ) and the Community Reintegration Center (CRC). Milwaukee County never implemented this order.

On October 28, 2025, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted ruling FCC 25-75A1, which rescinded order DA 25-565. Under this new ruling, counties are now permitted to collect commissions on inmate phone calls and video visitation services. As a result, phone call rates can increase up to \$0.10 per minute, while video visitation rates can increase up to \$0.19 per minute for facilities comparable in size to the Milwaukee County Jail (MCJ) and the Community Reintegration Center (CRC). Milwaukee County has not yet increased phone or video visitation rates.

The Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office and the Community Reintegration Center:

- 1.1.1 continue to provide free calling and free video visitation to all PIOC at the MCJ and CRC;
- 1.1.2 continue all existing IPCS, Tablet Services, and investigative functionality currently in place;
- 1.1.3 collect revenue to fund PIOC programming and services by increasing the per-minute rates for IPCS and collecting site commissions as permitted through FCC 25-75A1; and

1.1.4 comply with FCC 25-75A1.

Table above represents \$0.04 increase in calling rates and \$0.08 to video visitation rates. \$0.02 will go to IC Solutions for phone calls and \$0.02 will be reimbursed to Milwaukee County for phone calls. For video visitation \$0.06 will go to IC Solutions and \$0.02 will be reimbursed to Milwaukee County for video visitation. Milwaukee County will receive 4% commission on tablet usage which will project an estimated \$674,482.12 in revenue for both the MCJ and the CRC. This estimate is still below the \$250,000

budgeted for the Milwaukee County Jail (MCJ) and \$600,000 budgeted for the Community Reintegration Center (CRC) leaving a budget shortfall estimated at \$75,500.

RECOMMENDATION

From the Chief Deputy, Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office, requesting approval of amendment # 4 to Milwaukee County's agreement with the Inmate Calling Solutions LLC (ICSolutions) for correctional communication services to act in accordance with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) order FCC 25-75A1: 2025 IPCS (Incarcerated People's Communications Services) Implementation of the Martha Wright-Reed Act, Adopted October 28, 2025

FISCAL EFFECT

In the County Executive's 2026 Recommended Operating Budget, and in the Milwaukee County 2026 Adopted Operating Budget, revenue from phone and tablet usage was increased by approximately \$250,000 for the Milwaukee County Jail (MCJ) and \$600,000 for the Community Reintegration Center (CRC).
