A RESOLUTION/ORDINANCE

Amending Chapter 99 of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances to conform to Wisconsin State Statutes § 323.14 and § 323.15 establishing an emergency management plan, program, and the appointment of an Emergency Management Director, by recommending adoption of the following:

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 323.14(1)(a)(2) provides that "[i]n counties having a county executive under s. 59.17, the county board shall designate the county executive or confirm his or her appointee as county head of emergency management"; and

WHEREAS, one of the duties of the county head of emergency management is to respond, on behalf of the county, to state of emergencies declared by the Governor under Wis. Stat. § 323.15(4); and

WHEREAS, the 2015 Adopted Budget created the Department of Emergency Management that included a Director of Emergency Management and on January 31, 2015 the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors adopted File No. 14-919 amending the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances (MCGO) Section 99.02(1) to acknowledge the creation of the department; and

WHEREAS, Section 99.02 of the MCGO was amended to read that "in accordance with s. 323.14(1)(a)(2), Wis. Stats., the county executive is hereby designated as the county emergency management director. In addition to the duties herein set forth, the county executive shall coordinate and direct, all administrative and management functions of the county emergency management program in accordance with ch.323, Wis. Stats"; and

WHEREAS, Section 99.04 of the MCGO states that "in the event of a declaration of emergency proclaimed by the governor, pursuant to his powers under ch. 166, Wis. Stats., the sheriff shall assume direct control of the county emergency management program, and shall execute all directives and orders received from the governor of this state or included in resolutions, ordinances or other pronouncements of the county board"; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 323.14(1)(a)(2) and the MCGO conflict as MCGO Sections 99.04 and 99.085(a) references the sheriff as the controlling authority of the county when the Governor declares an emergency and that the sheriff is responsible for implementation of subsurface and surface rescue and recovery operations; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the Milwaukee County Office of Corporation Counsel authored an opinion on Section 99.04 of the MCGO hereto attached to this file and concluded that Chapter 99 was updated to reflect changes in state law and renumber references in the MCGO from state statute chapter 166 to 323, however sheriff still appears improperly in subsections 99.04, 99.05, 99.06, 99.07 and 99.085 and Wis.Stat.166 is referenced in sections 99.03, 99.04, 99.06 and 99.08 which is now obsolete: and

WHEREAS, the opinion of Corporation Counsel further suggests that when Chapter 99 was amended in 2015, that the failure to replace sheriff with emergency management director was an oversight and that a court would likely rule in favor of finding that the Emergency Management Director acts as the head of the emergency management program when the Governor declares an emergency; and

The Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors ordains the following:

Section 1. Chapter 99 of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

Section 99.03 – Policy-making/rule-making committee.

The committee on judiciary, safety and general services of the county board is established as the standing committee of the county board that shall retain policymaking and rule-making powers in the establishment and development of county emergency management plans and programs under ch. 323 166.03(4)(c), Wis. Stats.

80 Section 99.04 – State of emergency declared by the governor. 81 82 In the event of a declaration of emergency proclaimed by the governor, pursuant to 83 his powers under ch. 323 166, Wis. Stats., the emergency management director sheriff 84 shall assume direct control of the county emergency management program, and shall 85 execute all directives and orders received from the governor of this state or included in 86 resolutions, ordinances or other pronouncements of the county board. 87 88 Section 99.05 – Utilization of existing services and facilities. 89 90 (1) Policy. In carrying out county emergency management responsibilities under this 91 chapter, all services, equipment, supplies and facilities of the various 92 departments of county government may be utilized. All departments of county 93 government, and their personnel, are directed to cooperate and extend such 94 services, equipment, supplies and facilities as are required of them. 95 96 (2) Responsibility. In order to assure that in the event of an emergency all the 97 facilities of the existing county government are expanded to the fullest to meet 98 such emergency, the following specific responsibilities are assigned to the 99 following department heads named as coordinators of county emergency 100 management: 101 102 (a) Director of emergency management—coordinator of emergency operating 103 center operations, special staff officer to county executive (operations) 104 sheriff. 105 106 (b) Director of department of administration administrative services— 107 coordinator of administration and facilities. 108 (c) Sheriff—coordinator of public safety and security. 109 110 111 (d) Director of human services—coordinator of health and welfare. 112 113 (e) Director of transportation public works and development—coordinator of 114 highways, transit public works and airport sanitation. 115 116 (f) Corporation counsel—special staff officer to county executive and county 117 board (legal). 118 119 (3) Duties. All departments and institutions shall be charted on a functional 120 organization chart based on their responsibilities and duties, as outlined in the

121 current county emergency operations plan and pursuant to ch. <u>323</u> 166, Wis. 122 Stats.

Section 99.06 – Unification and consolidation of county emergency management functions.

To reduce the overall cost of the emergency management to the county, and to increase the efficiency and effectiveness to the various emergency management units within the county, the <u>emergency management director</u> sheriff, wherever appropriate, may negotiate agreements of mutual aid with other municipalities or counties in the metropolitan community pursuant to <u>ch. 323</u> 166, s. 59.03(2)(a) 59.083(1) or 66.0301 66.30, Wis. Stats. Such agreements shall not be binding on the county until approved by the county board of supervisors.

Section 99.07 – Federal and state contributions to civil defense.

The <u>emergency management director</u> sheriff, when appropriate, shall apply in the name of the county for federal and state funds and sign, in the name of the county, any necessary granting agreements with the state and federal governments.

Section 99.08 – Designation of alternate site for county government.

Whenever, during the continuance of a state of emergency proclaimed by the governor under ch. 323 166, Wis. Stats., it becomes imprudent, inexpedient or impossible to conduct the affairs of the county at the regular or usual place of business in the courthouse within the City of Milwaukee, the county board, upon call of the presiding officer or his/her successor, shall assemble and meet at any place within or without the territorial limits of the county pursuant to ch. 323 166, Wis. Stats. Said meeting place is hereby designated to be the alternate or substitute as a temporary emergency location for the conduct and transaction of all public business by the county board, and other officers of the county shall exercise as such location pursuant to ch. 323 166, Wis. Stats., all of the executive, legislative, administrative and judicial powers and functions conferred upon this governing body and officers by or under the laws of this state, and all acts of this governing body and officers shall be valid and binding as if performed within the territorial limits of the county.

Section 99.085 – Intent and policy; definitions; assistance to other agencies; sheriff's duties.

(1) Declaration of policy. It is the intent of the county board to implement and comply with ss. <u>59.54(2)</u> 59.07(42) and <u>59.27(11)</u> 59.23(11), Wis. Stats., and thereby appropriate money for the purchase of boats and other equipment allowing the

162 sheriff to conduct operations in county waters for the rescue of human beings 163 and recovery of human bodies. 164 (2) Definitions. "Emergencies" shall be defined as events arising out of a natural or civil disaster as declared by the governor, the directives of the county executive 165 166 sheriff, or resolutions, ordinances or other pronouncements of the county board 167 as provided in section 99.04 of this chapter. 168 169 (3) Requests from other governmental agencies. When, pursuant to s. 59.28(2) 170 59.24(2), Wis. Stats., the sheriff receives an order or request to assist other law 171 enforcement agencies, municipal, state and federal, in search and rescue 172 operations, the sheriff may respond with such assistance without a formal 173 declaration of emergency, as provided in subsection (2) of this section. 174 175 (4) Sheriff to implement. 176 177 (a) The sheriff is directed to designate adequate personnel to act as standby alert 178 for subsurface and surface rescue and recovery operations and is directed to 179 provide an adequate training program for such personnel. 180 181 (b) He/She The sheriff is further ordered to maintain and preserve the equipment 182 for rescue and recovery in a good and usable condition. 183 184 (c) The sheriff is further directed to request the county board for proper 185 budgetary appropriations for the operation of this standby program. 186 187 Section 2. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and 188 publication. 189 190 191 192
