## **REQUEST**

The Executive Director of Milwaukee County Parks is requesting passive review of a professional service agreement in an amount not to exceed \$153,467, including any future amendments, for final design and development of habitat restoration plan sets for Little Menomonee River Parkway Section 1 in the Area of Concern.

## **POLICY**

Implementation of Wisconsin Statutes 59.21(31) with regard to purchase of professional service agreements (under the Milwaukee General Ordinance Chapter 56) for Capital projects requires County Board review to award the initial agreement, or fee extension(s) to the original agreement, when the total contractual fee exceeds \$100,000 but is less than \$300,000.

## **BACKGROUND**

This project will complete the planning and design process to identify upland work for LMRP Section 1 including the development of an Ecological Restoration and Management Plan, as well as aquatic site assessments and a Basis of Design Report (feasibility study) to inform and support and design for aquatic habitat enhancements. All work is conducted in coordination with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) and the AOC Fish & Wildlife Technical Advisory Committee (Tech Team).

In May 2020, Milwaukee County entered into a grant agreement with WDNR for the purpose of implementing fish and wildlife habitat recommendations in the Little Menomonee River corridor. The expiration date of the grant agreement is December 31, 2023

The Service Contract for Little Menomonee River Section 1 was awarded to Ozaukee County on May 31, 2021. The contract is recorded as contract No. 274.

According to the 2021 Service Contract, Ozaukee County was to be compensated for performance of its contracted obligations such that payments would not exceed \$252,467 in the aggregate until the expiration of the contract on December 31, 2023. The 2021 Service Contract had an Initial Term expiring on December 31, 2021, with compensation in the amount of \$99,000 in the first term of the contract, and the remaining due during the 2022-2023 extension of the contract.

On January 1, 2022, the County extended the Service Contract through December 31, 2023, in accordance with the duration of the grant agreement. However, due to an oversight, the contract amounts were not updated during the execution of the extensions, and not accurately reflected in the county financial system. It is now necessary to bring the contract to passive review to amend the contract to reflect that \$153,467 is still available from the grant funding to cover the contractor's costs accrued in 2022 and 2023. At this time, invoices submitted cannot be paid due to insufficient balance to pay bills submitted in 2022 and 2023 in the county financial system.
