I. Mayor Bukiewicz called the meeting to order at 1:15 pm.

II. Welcome to the City of Wauwatosa

Mayor McBride welcomed members to the City of Wauwatosa. The building hosting the meeting is a newly renovated historic site. This site was host to many Potawatomi and Menominee villages. The first European/American settlement named Hart was located about 200 feet down the river. These same brothers founded Hartford Connecticut. The railroad that goes through Wauwatosa is the main line from Chicago to Seattle. The oldest commercial building is about 200 yards away, called The Little Red Store built in 1854. Wauwatosa had about 3 or 4 quarries. The doctor for the county hospital, Dr. Day, was a fossil collector. He would pay workers for the fossils and there are fossils here in this building in the fireplace downstairs. Dr. Days fossil collection is at Harvard University, the University of Michigan and UWM. Geologists come from around the world to study the fossils. This building was built in late 1930's with money from the New Deal and the America Rescue Act it was renovated last year. The rooftop is covered with solar panels. About 70% of power for the city buildings is paid by solar.



III. Approval of the April 14, 2025 meeting minutes.

It was moved by President Besson, seconded by President Stalewski, to approve the April 14, 2025 meeting minutes. All voted aye.

IV. ICC Election Chair/Secretary, Vice-Chair, Treasurer

Mayor Kennedy nominated Mayor Bukiewicz of Oak Creek Chair/Secretary, Mayor Devine of West Allis as Vice Chair, and President Besson of Hales Corners as Treasurer for the ICC. No further nominations for the offices were made. All voted aye.

- VI. Milwaukee County Assoc. of Fire Chiefs, Intergovernmental Agreement between Milwaukee County and Municipalities EMS- Motion to appoint ICC member to committee

The Fire Chiefs advised that the committee members are in place. There has been a request at the April 2025 ICC meeting that members of the ICC be placed on the committee to represent the ICC. Mike Hawes suggested that ICC members should be part of the discussion. Mayor Kennedy advised the Chiefs are already meeting, other than the formula for the money, he suggested allowing the Chiefs to continue their discussion. Once they are done, have an ICC meeting to discuss any changes to the formula. Chief Lipski spoke about how the formula met the needs of the communities. The ICC discussed this process and agreed that the Chiefs should continue and then come back to the ICC. President Besson moved, Mayor Kennedy second to not appoint ICC members to the committee at this time and allow the committee to continue its work independently from the ICC.

Mayor Jankowski inquired if the formula was created in 2016. The formula is distributed by OEM, the number may go down because there may be more units. Jordan Primakow asked if the County can give a presentation on how the money is distributed and spent. County can also share what the scope of money they are working with. President Besson asked that the information is shared with ICC members prior to meeting and discussion. Current formula is a 2.5 million dollars, it's a 60/40 split. There are fluctuations around 10k each year. This is only one component of the overarching agreement. Mike Hawes asked if the agreement touches on the level of service provided. The agreement offers more services to all municipalities. All voted aye.

Mayor McBride advised that right now the question is whether there will be funding for transit. The Flexride program has been very successful, however it can only continue if businesses invest in the program.

8. Heroin Task Force (Mayor Bukiewicz)

Mayor Bukiewicz advised the task force is on a hiatus until further notice.

9. Employ Milwaukee (City of Milwaukee)

Millie advised that thy are still offering the FlexRide program and the FlexRide for the working parents. Employ Milwaukee is working with Cream City and hosting a youth fair is focused on construction. They have a hiring event for construction on June 24th at Employ Milwaukee, applicants must be 18 or older. There is a Quest program in early childcare. This program is good for young parents that can bring their children to work.

10. Legislative Update – Jordan Primakow/Alec Knutson

Mayor Devine spoke on the LWM day about budget disparities. There are updates from Toni Heckert and the League is sharing that information. There was a meeting with the National League of Cities and Congressman Moore's office. Reach out to Representative Fitzgerald and Representative Stiel to advocate for municipal funds. The National League of Cities is trying to a put a local municipal voice in that discussion. Jordan Primakow stated they are focused on the same work.

Mayor Kennedy advised there is a non-partisan zip code bill. The bill directs the USPS to allocate one zip code for each municipality.
