4 **A RESOLUTION**

6 Declaring Milwaukee County a sanctuary for trans and non-binary individuals  
7

8  
9 WHEREAS, in the last few years, states have advanced a record number of bills  
10 that attack LGBTQ rights, especially transgender youth; and  
11

12 WHEREAS, so far in this year’s legislative session, state lawmakers across the  
13 country have introduced 491 bills that restrict fundamentals like health care, education,  
14 and the freedom of expression for LGBTQ+ people, according to analysis from the  
15 American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU); and  
16

17 WHEREAS, the American Civil Liberties Union has tracked legislation which  
18 takes many forms including:

- 19 • Bills that attempt to limit the ability to update gender information on IDs  
20 and records, such as birth certificates and driver’s licenses.
- 21 • Bills that attempt to undermine and weaken nondiscrimination laws by  
22 allowing employers, businesses, and hospitals to turn away LGBTQ  
23 people or refuse them equal treatment.
- 24 • Bills that restrict how and when LGBTQ people can be themselves,  
25 limiting access to books about them and trying to ban or censor  
26 performances like drag shows.
- 27 • Bills that target access to medically-necessary health care for transgender  
28 people; ban affirming care for trans youth; create criminal penalties for  
29 providing this care; and bills that block funding to medical centers that  
30 offer gender-affirming care, or block insurance coverage of health care for  
31 transgender people.
- 32 • Public accommodations bills seek to prohibit transgender people from  
33 using facilities like public bathrooms and locker rooms.
- 34 • Bills that prevent trans students from participating in school activities like  
35 sports, force teachers to out students, and censor any in-school  
36 discussions of LGBTQ people and issues.

39 WHEREAS, according to a survey by the Trevor Project, a suicide prevention  
40 group focused on LGBTQ+ youth, found that 86 percent of trans or non-binary youth  
41 reported negative effects on their mental health stemming from the political debate  
42 around trans issues, and nearly half have seriously considered suicide in the past year;

45 WHEREAS, in this hostile environment, some cities and counties across the  
46 country are taking steps to support and protect trans and non-binary individuals; and

WHEREAS, Kansas City, Missouri recently approved measures indicating the city will not prosecute or fine any person or organization that seeks, provides, receives or helps someone to receive gender-affirming care such as puberty blockers, hormones or surgery. The resolution also says that if the state passes a law or resolution that imposes criminal or civil punishments, fines or professional sanctions in such cases, personnel in the city will make enforcing those requirements “their lowest priority”; and

WHEREAS, last year Austin, Texas declared it should be considered a sanctuary for transgender youth and their families, and Harris County, home to Houston, declared it wouldn’t pursue cases against parents over gender-affirming care; and

WHEREAS, California, Minnesota, and Washington have declared themselves sanctuary states for gender-affirming care, as have the cities of Chicago, Minneapolis and West Hollywood; and

WHEREAS, Dane County, Wisconsin adopted a resolution that declared the county a “sanctuary” for transgender and non-binary individuals; and

WHEREAS, transgender Americans are four times more likely to be victims of violent crime than their cisgender peers, according to a 2021 study; and

WHEREAS Milwaukee County values its transgender and non-binary residents and vigorously opposes measures that would allow legal violence toward trans people in accessing gender-affirming care or expression; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Judiciary, Law Enforcement, and General Services, at its meeting of September 11, 2023, recommended adoption of File No. 23-694 (vote 3-2); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors firmly asserts its commitment to protect transgender and non-binary individuals and believes access to health care is a fundamental right and all people in Milwaukee County and the State of Wisconsin should have access to all health care, including gender affirming care; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if the state of Wisconsin passes a law that imposes criminal or civil punishments, fines, or professional sanctions on any person or organization that seeks, provides, receives or helps someone to receive gender-affirming care such as puberty blockers, hormones, or surgery, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors urges the Milwaukee County Sheriff to make enforcement their lowest priority; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Milwaukee County be considered a safe place, a sanctuary, for transgender children and adults and their families; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Office of Government Affairs is hereby authorized and requested to communicate the contents of this resolution to Governor
