

Milwaukee County Commission on Aging Aging Services Director's Report – October 2025

Administration

- Attended Milwaukee County Age Friendly Communities Steering
 Committee meetings and helped to facilitate AARP survey distribution.
- Prepared for **2026 Administrative Renewals** of existing contracts.
- Supported DHHS, CEX, Parks, Economic Development and Administrative Services regarding MKE HUBS re-envisioning initiative.
- Met with County IT Services and US Bank representatives to develop an electronic payment system for contributions to OAA programming.
- Initiated a new process to track and collect Medicaid Waiver payments for the Home Delivered Meal program.

Advocacy

- Monitoring impact of the federal government shutdown and preparing for any contingencies.
- Supported draft legislation, AB-410 and SB-410, which provides funding for grants for falls prevention awareness and initiatives in Wisconsin.
- Initiated weekly in-person Medicare Counseling at the Coggs center and with trained volunteer SHIP counselors at senior centers. Conducted four Medicare 101 presentations in the community.

Social Support Services

- Evaluated RFP responses and selected vendor for OAA Legal Services, Elder Benefit Services and Medicare Counseling.
- Conducted data audits of all programs matching fiscal data and invoices against program data entered into **PeerPlace** by service category.

Transportation

- Promoted public input into the City of Milwaukee's first citywide
 Transportation & Mobility Plan, which will guide how the city designs, operates, maintains, and invests in its streets.
- Sponsoring Week Without Driving September 29 October 5.
- Caregiver and Dementia Care specialist teams, Transportation Coordinator hosted Navigating the Road Together on covering safe driving, alternative transportation options, and WisDOT driving regulations.
- OATS transportation has experienced significant growth in rider volume. In order to control costs, no new riders will be added to the program in 2025.



Cultural destinations and individual grocery rides will be eliminated, along with a reduction in certain rides to senior centers.

Senior Centers

- Request for Proposal for Programming and Meal Site Supervision in the Milwaukee County senior centers closes at the end of October.
- Paused release of the Request for Proposal for Senior Center serving
 Spanish-speaking older adults until next year.
- Facilitated a **third information session** with **Kelly senior center** participants based upon feedback from the **tour and listening session** at **Bucyrus site**.
- Phase 1 of construction underway at Clinton and Bernice Rose Senior
 Center under Flexible Facilities grant program. Provided recommendations for additional accessibility improvements to add on to project.
- McGovern Park and Hart Park senior centers remain closed due to flooding.
- Remediation at McGovern senior center did not clear all mold. Facilities is evaluating next steps. Participants joined in activities at other centers.

Nutrition Services

- Expanded senior dining services at Milwaukee Community Crossroad's Multicultural Senior Center.
- Successfully closed Senior Dining Sites at four Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee sites and transitioned diners to alternative options.
- Provided resources including nutrition counseling, information about alternative dining sites, and the availability of OATS transportation for residents at the four senior meal sites that were closed.
- Added new vendor Chik 'N Dip for the preparation of Halal meals at the Muslim Community Health Center along with a food truck on Tuesdays.

Health & Wellness

- The wellness team received a Localizing Efforts to Address Falls miniaward from the Wisconsin Institute for Healthy Aging to extend falls prevention work to community pharmacies.
- Evidence Based Prevention Coordinator Jennifer Lefeber has moved on from her county role. Community Health Coordinator Kaisa Kerrigan is developing a plan to ensure continuity in wellness programming.
- A second session of Wellness Initiative for Senior Education will be hosted at Wilson Park senior center by Milwaukee County Behavioral Health staff.
- Hosted 28 Health & Wellness workshops including Stepping On.



Caregiver Support

- Caregiver Support Coordinator Kayla Steinke was a panelist for the Women in Aging Careers virtual panel hosted by the Student Gerontology Association at UWM.
- Caregiver support team participated in two community events:
 - o Ensure You're Ensured: Caregivers Guide to Medicare and Medicaid Made Simple at Milwaukee Public Library-Washington Park Branch.
 - o **Alzheimer's and Dementia Awareness** event at St. Martin DePorres church.
- Processed \$40,000 USAging grant: Understanding, Testing & Evaluation of Caregiver Navigator Services to evaluate approaches for delivering caregiver navigation programs.
- Caregiver Support Specialist Migdalia Pacheco Pacheco is collaborating with Dementia Care Specialist Cristina Huitron to host the second ever Powerful Tool for Caregivers course in Spanish in Milwaukee County.
- Established 225 Caregiver Support Grants with families. All funds budgeted for direct financial support to family caregivers have been allocated. New family caregivers seeking financial support will be added to a waitlist.

Outreach

Medicare Outreach Specialist, Ginger Rogers, will hold weekly office hours on the first floor of the Coggs building to assist residents during the open enrollment period on Wednesdays between October 15 – December 3 from 10 AM – 2 PM to answer questions and help with plan finding.
