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### **REQUEST**

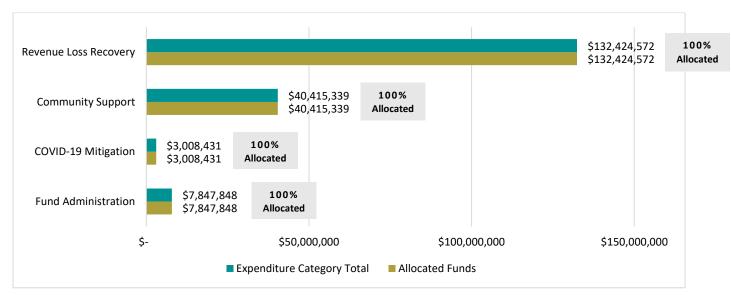
This report is intended to provide an update on the Milwaukee County American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) project pipeline and expenditure category allocations approved during the Milwaukee County ARPA Task Force Meeting on September 2, 2021.

### POLICY

Milwaukee County Board file 21-555: "A resolution to create a Task Force to review and recommend funding allocations to the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors for monies received by the County in the Federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021"

#### BACKGROUND

On September 2, 2021, the ARPA Task Force approved ARPA Expenditure Categories and a process for reviewing and recommending ARPA funding allocations. Since that time ARPA funding requests have been submitted based on the Milwaukee County ARPA Expenditure Categories (Community Support, COVID-19 Mitigation, Fund Administration, and Revenue Loss Recovery). This report serves to provide an update on projects approved for ARPA funding by the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (Tables A, B, C, & D) and ARPA Funds Allocated and Available (Chart A) as of November 29, 2023. Milwaukee County Expenditure Category updates are provided below. Milwaukee County has allocated 100% of its ARPA aid (\$183,696,190).

### Milwaukee County Expenditure Category Updates

**Community Support.** Milwaukee County received 128 unduplicated ARPA funding requests totaling \$323,592,732 within the Community Support Expenditure Category. From these requests, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors approved 22 projects totaling \$40,415,339. In March 2023, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors approved the Reducing Medical Debt project for \$1,613,988 in ARPA funds to purchase and forgive Milwaukee County residents' medical debt (File 23-377). The Reducing Medical Debt project will not be implemented and there is a recommendation that the \$1,613,988 of ARPA funds be transferred to two existing ARPA projects: Flexible Housing Subsidy Pool (21-861) and the Credible Messenger Program (22-418) in an upcoming action item.

# Community Support Total Allocation \$40,415,339

**Revenue Loss Recovery.** Milwaukee County received a total of 78 unduplicated project requests totaling \$246,978,284 in this category. The Board of Supervisors approved 45 projects totaling \$132,424,572 (Table B). Approved projects influence one or more of the following areas: fiscal health, capital improvements, deferred maintenance, or operational improvements. **COVID-19 Mitigation.** As of November 28, 2023, Milwaukee County updated the allowable uses within the COVID-19 Mitigation Expenditure Category. Milwaukee County departments with approved COVID-19 Mitigation projects may spend approved funds through December 29, 2023. Departments that continue to purchase PPE or other COVID-19 Mitigation items in 2024 must be covered by the department's tax levy dollars. However, if projects support COVID-19 testing for Milwaukee County employees or individuals in congregate settings or provide vaccination incentives to individuals in congregate settings, funding will continue into 2024. Milwaukee County made these changes in anticipate of ARPA spending deadlines and in planning for reallocation of unspent funds in 2024.

The Milwaukee County COVID-19 Mitigation form for departments to apply for funding is now closed. As of November 28, 2023, Milwaukee County received a total of 33 requests for COVID-19 mitigation funds of which 25 requests were approved. In the third quarter of 2023, the County submitted \$118,751 of COVID-19 Mitigation expenses and \$208,441 of COVID-19 Mitigation obligations to the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

SBP submitted a final FEMA claim of \$477,231 in expenses from February 28, 2021 through May 11, 2023, for eligible COVID-19 mitigation expenses on October 31, 2023. This reimbursement will offset the need to claim these costs to Milwaukee County's ARPA allocation.

*Fund Administration*. A total of six projects totaling \$7,847,848 were approved in the Fund Administration Expenditure Category (Table D). Approved projects support Milwaukee County to manage and coordinate the use of ARPA funds to ensure strong programmatic support and fiscal accountability, timely reporting and alignment with supplementary funding.

In partnership with the Office of the Comptroller (OoC), the PMO submitted the 2023 third quarterly expenditure report on October 30, 2023, to the U.S. Department of Treasury (Attachment A). The total amount of expenditures submitted to the U.S. Department of Treasury was \$17,243,990 with \$67,644,967 in total obligations.

With 100% of ARPA funds allocated, the OoC and SBP are conducting fiscal monitoring to ensure successful, timely spend-down of funds. The OoC and SBP are working with project leads that represent ARPA-approved operating projects. A survey was sent to project leads to assess project progress and OoC and SBP are meeting with project leads to review survey findings. To ensure successful implementation of capital projects, SBP and OoC are working with the Central Business Office to monitor spending progress.

Milwaukee County entered into a Professional Services Agreement for ARPA Program Evaluation Services. The consulting firm, Guidehouse, Inc., will perform an evaluability assessment and will use the results of that assessment to guide the development of an actionable and replicable Evaluation Framework for Milwaukee County's ARPA-funded projects that includes project-level evaluation plans. Throughout the next six months, Guidehouse, Inc. will work with Milwaukee County to develop an evaluation plan that will be implemented in Phase Two of the ARPA Evaluation Project.

The U.S. Department of the Treasury released a revision to the <u>SLFRF Interim Final Rule</u> that further defines obligation requirements on November 9, 2023. SBP has shared this information with the OoC and will issue further guidance to departments to ensure successful spend down of ARPA funding.
