AN AMENDED RESOLUTION

Giving support to the Milwaukee Mental Health Board to provide funding for the "We Can Save Lives Tour," which provides suicide prevention training in Wisconsin

WHEREAS, the mental health crisis in Wisconsin has reached alarming levels, with suicide being the second leading cause of death for teens and young adults; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors is dedicated to improving the mental health of the residents of the County; and

WHEREAS, Friendship Circle of Wisconsin established UMatter in 2021 to address this crisis through suicide prevention and mental health programming, fostering safety, inclusion, and connection within the community; and

WHEREAS, Friendship Circle personnel are certified SafeTALK trainers and have successfully conducted workshops for community members; and

WHEREAS, SafeTALK is a nationally recognized, evidence-based training program developed by LivingWorks that certifies participants as suicide-alert helpers, equipping them with essential skills to intervene and save lives; and

WHEREAS, the "We Can Save Lives Tour," a SafeTALK Suicide Prevention Training Tour across Wisconsin, is dedicated to training 1,000 individuals at no cost to participants in memory of Alderman Jonathan Brostoff, who passed away at the age of 41, and aims to address the urgent need for suicide prevention awareness and training in our communities; and

WHEREAS, funding for the "We Can Save Lives Tour" from the Milwaukee County Department of Health and Human services would provide up to four SafeTALK suicide prevention trainings and two teen support groups, as well as providing support for related community work that The Friendship Circle does in Milwaukee County; and

WHEREAS, collaboration with Milwaukee County Behavioral Health Services will amplify the reach and impact of The Friendship Circle's UMatter programming, fostering critical support networks and enhancing community resilience in addressing the mental health crisis; and

WHEREAS, investing in programming and resources for suicide prevention saves lives and improves the mental health of those involved and raises the well-being for all residents in Milwaukee County; and

48	WHEREAS, suicide prevention training has many benefits for those who
49	receive it, including building empathy, recognizing early warning signs,
50	increasing communication skills, and reducing stigma; and

52	WHEREAS, there is a National Suicide Prevention Lifeline available by
53	calling or texting 988 to provide anyone in need with access to trained crisis
54	counselors; and

56	WHEREAS, the Mental Health Board has the exclusive authority to fund and
57	legislate matters of mental health according to Wisconsin Act 203; and

59	WHEREAS, the Committee on Health Equity, Human Needs, and Strategic
30	Planning, at its meeting of January 23, 2025, recommended adoption of File No. 25-117
31	as amended (vote 4-1); now, therefore,

33	BE IT RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors requests the
34	Milwaukee County Mental Health Board to consider funding in the amount of \$150,000
35	for the "We Can Save Lives Tour" and related programming and resources
