
MCDOT's mission is to a deliver an accessible transportation system that is fiscally secure, reliable and ensures the safety of the traveling public while enhancing quality of life for the communities we serve.

MCDOT's values align to those of the County as a whole:

- Inclusion: We actively seek diverse perspectives when making decisions.
- Influence: We collectively use our platform to positively impact our community.
- **Integrity**: We do the right thing knowing that nobody's going to know whether we did it or not.
- **Safety**: We always provide a safe environment for both our staff and the public.



While MCDOT plays a role in advancing the County's strategic plan overall, we most directly advance the following Milwaukee County Strategic Focus Areas: 1A, 1B, 3C.



More specifically, MCDOT delivers on its mission by advancing five overall goals, each of which align to one or more of the County's overall Strategic Focus Areas. The table below shows the alignment between MCDOT's goals and the County's. It also explains how we will know when we are successful at achieving each of the 2027 Goals.

Safety	3A, 3C	People are and feel safer when traveling throughout Milwaukee County.	There is a reduction in traffic-related crashes and deaths on roads throughout Milwaukee County, especially those within our jurisdictional authority.
Fiscal Health	3B	Establishment of a dedicated funding source for transit operations and focused investments that create operational efficiencies in all MCDOT service areas.	MCDOT and the County are more competitive for, and have secured more, external funding to advance County goals without having to be regularly subjected to the prospect of service reductions.
