12	WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) is innovating the way
13	people across southeast Wisconsin get to work, school, medical appointments,
14 15	entertainment and anywhere else they need to go; and
16	WHEREAS, at the June 18, 2025 meeting of the Committee on Finance, the
17	Milwaukee County Department of Transportation reported a projected \$10.9 million
18	deficit in the MCTS departmental budget; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, MCTS estimates that fare evasion in 2024 reduced revenues by
21	approximately \$4 million, based on a systemwide fare evasion rate of 25%; and
22 23	WHEREAS, if fare evasion were reduced to 15% systemwide, MCTS projects
24	that an additional \$3 million in revenue could be realized; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, amid ongoing concerns about the budget of MCTS, improving fare
27	compliance is a necessary strategy to strengthen revenue and ensure long-term
28	sustainability; and
29 30	WHEREAS, the CONNECT 1: Wisconsin Avenue Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) route
31	launched June 2023 with free rides; and
32	Tadrioriou Gario 2020 With 1100 Hado, and
33	WHEREAS, in April 2024, CONNECT 1 began utilizing a pre-board payment
34	model, lacking the onboard fare verification system used on other MCTS routes; and

36	WHEREAS, a January 2025 survey conducted by MCTS found an estimated
37 38	24.6% overall fare evasion rate across 249 trips on multiple routes, with fare evasion on CONNECT 1 higher at 33%, indicating disproportionately lower fare compliance on this
39	route; and

41	WHEREAS, any approach to fare enforcement must prioritize operator and rider
42	safety while promoting fairness, equity, and fiscal responsibility; and
43	
44	WHEREAS, Milwaukee County is committed to developing data-driven solutions

to improve fare compliance and reduce fare evasion without increasing risk to operators or passengers; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Transportation and Transit, at its meeting of July 9, 2025, recommended adoption of File No. 25-479 (vote 4-0); and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance, at its meeting of July 17, 2025, recommended adoption of File No. 25-479 (vote 7-0); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors requests MCTS to provide strategic and data-driven recommendations to reduce bus fare evasion without creating a safety issue for operators or other passengers that could be considered for funding as part of the 2026 Budget; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors requests MCTS to develop and submit a data-informed, rider- and operator-safe security and fare compliance strategy for the CONNECT 1 route that:

- A) Implements a more rigorous fare enforcement strategy for the CONNECT 1 route that achieves fare compliance rates on par with other MCTS routes; and/or
- B) Recommends discontinuing the pre-board payment system on the CONNECT 1 route and transitions to requiring fare payment upon entry to the bus; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the complete report shall be submitted to the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors no later than the September 2025 meeting cycle.
