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From the Director, Office of Performance, Strategy, and Budget, Department of Administrative Services, requesting retroactive authorization to apply for and accept, if awarded, the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) for Federal Fiscal Year 2019, by recommending adoption of the following:

A RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, as of July 29, 2019, the Office of Performance, Strategy, and Budget, Department of Administrative Services, received notification from the United States Department of Justice (U.S. DOJ) that 2019 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grants (JAG) solicitations were posted; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. DOJ requires the qualifying localities to negotiate a Memorandum of Understanding regarding the administration and distribution of funds; and

WHEREAS, the following localities are eligible for funding in the total amount of \$933,259: the City of Milwaukee (the City), Milwaukee County (the County), and the City of West Allis; and

WHEREAS, funding is awarded to municipalities based on the average annual number of Part 1 violent crimes reported by the unit to the Federal Bureau of Investigation; and

WHEREAS, since the County bears the cost of prosecution and incarceration that arise out of Part 1 violent crimes, the U.S. DOJ has declared the County a disparate jurisdiction, and therefore eligible to share in the funding awarded to municipalities located within the County; and

WHEREAS, it was agreed that, net the City of West Allis allocation of \$20,892, funding would be split evenly with the Milwaukee Police Department and the County, each funding one-half of the cost of the Community Justice Council Director position, housed at the Wisconsin Policy Forum (WPF) at an amount totaling \$108,577; and

WHEREAS, the City and the County may split evenly the net amount of funds after the WPF Director is paid for equally between the two; and

WHEREAS, the JAG does not require a local match; and

WHEREAS, the County will be the fiscal agent for the JAG; and

WHEREAS, in order to meet the grant requirements, a separate trust fund must be established to deposit the grant monies, which the County will receive; and
