("Agency"), a Wisconsin 11 non-stock, non- profit corporation located at 8701 Watertown Plank Road, Wauwatosa, WI 53226 and 12 Milwaukee County Office of Emergency Management ("County"), a governmental agency located at 633 13 W. Wisconsin Ave., Suite 700, Milwaukee, WI 53203, for the provision of health policy advisory services. 14 Together, County and Agency, shall be referred to as "Parties". 15 16 **RECITALS:** 17 18 WHEREAS, The COVID-19 pandemic amplified the role of Milwaukee County in pandemic 19 response, health promotion and healthy equity; and 20 21 WHEREAS, County's goal to become the healthiest county in Wisconsin, elevated in this past 22 year, calls forth a need for strategic leadership around health promotion, disease prevention, 23 and equity; and 24 25 WHEREAS, as the County became highly visible in emergency coordination and response, so did the importance of a health advisor operating under the contract between Agency and County 26 27 for services, given the nature of the response; and 28 29 WHEREAS, while the scope of a health advisor would be distinct in scope from other established 30 health and medical roles in the County; and 31 32 WHEREAS, roles and responsibilities that have demonstrated value over this past year that are 33 not part of the usual scope of health and medical roles in the County include: 34 becoming a voice and face for the County internally and externally around COVID-19 35 and broader health promotion 36 consulting with public and private entities across the region on health promotion, 37 disease prevention, and equity 38 leading strategies that have demonstrated value across the region, state, and beyond, 39 such as the county dashboard, SAFER Model, and EVE Model, to pair racial/ethnic equity

with health equity in a meaningful, impactful, and measurable way; and

WHEREAS, in light of the foregoing, the County has identified a need for distinct health policy

advisory services that extend beyond the current scope of the other health and medical roles in

45		WHEREAS, the County and Agency desire to create a long-term contractual relationship by
46		which Agency, through a separate role of the Chief Health Policy Advisor, who can provide such
47		advisory services;
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49		WHEREAS, the Parties desire to amend the Agreement as more particularly set forth herein;
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51		NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and promises hereinafter made, the Parties
52		herebyagree as follows:
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54	1.	AMENDMENT TO TERM, TERMINATION REQUIREMENTS. The subsections of Article II are hereby
55		amended as follows:
56		A. Term. This Agreement shall be in force from August 1, 2022, until July 31, 2023. The
57		Parties may extend the term hereof by mutual agreement.
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59	2.	AMENDMENT TO COUNTY FUNDING/PAYENTS REQUIREMENTS. The subsections of Article IV
60		arehereby amended as follows:
61		A. County shall pay Agency \$113,666.22 for the services provided under the terms of this
62		Agreement.
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64		B. Agency shall issue invoices to County quarterly for \$28,416.55 for services that were
