

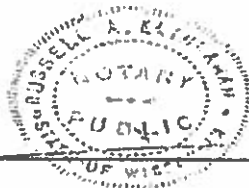

County Ordinance No. 20-10

AN ORDINANCE

The Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 99 of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

Section 99.03 - Policy-making/rule-making committee.

The committee on judiciary, safety and general services of the county board is established as the standing committee of the county board that shall retain policy-making and rule-making powers in the establishment and development of county emergency management plans and programs under ch. 323 466.03(4)(c), Wis. Stats.

Section 99.04 - State of emergency declared by the governor.

In the event of a declaration of emergency proclaimed by the governor, pursuant to his powers under ch. 323 466, Wis. Stats., the emergency management director shall assume direct control of the county emergency management program, and shall execute all directives and orders received from the governor of this state or included in resolutions, ordinances or other pronouncements of the county board.

Section 99.05 - Utilization of existing services and facilities.

(1) *Policy.* In carrying out county emergency management responsibilities under this chapter, all services, equipment, supplies and facilities of the various departments of county government may be utilized. All departments of county government, and their personnel, are directed to cooperate and extend such services, equipment, supplies and facilities as are required of them.

(2) *Responsibility.* In order to assure that in the event of an emergency all the facilities of the existing county government are expanded to the fullest to meet such emergency, the following specific responsibilities are assigned to the following department heads named as coordinators of county emergency management:

(a) Director of emergency management-coordinator of emergency operating center operations, special staff officer to

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~~county executive (operations) sheriff.~~

(b) Director of department of administration ~~administrative service~~ as coordinator of administration and facilities.

(c) Sheriff-coordinator of public safety and security.

Director of human services-coordinator of health and welfare.

(e) Director of ~~transportation~~ public works and development-coordinator of highways, transit public works and airport sanitation.

(f) Corporation counsel-special staff officer to county executive and county board (legal).

(3) *Duties.* All departments and institutions shall be charted on a functional organization chart based on their responsibilities and duties, as outlined in the current county emergency operations plan and pursuant to ch. 323.166, Wis. Stats.

Section 99.06 - Unification and consolidation of county emergency management functions.

To reduce the overall cost of the emergency management to the county, and to increase the efficiency and effectiveness to the various emergency management units within the county, the emergency management director sheriff, wherever appropriate, may negotiate agreements of mutual aid with other municipalities or counties in the metropolitan community pursuant to ch. 323.166, s. 59.03(2)(a) 59.083(4) or 66.0301 Wis. Stats. Such agreements shall not be binding on the county until approved by the county board of supervisors.

Section 99.07 - Federal and state contributions to civil defense.

The emergency management director sheriff, when appropriate, shall apply in the name of the county or federal and state funds and sign, in the name of the county, any necessary granting agreements with the state and federal governments.

Section 99.08 - Designation of alternate site for county government.

Whenever, during the continuance of a state of emergency proclaimed by the governor under ch. 323.166, Wis. Stats., it becomes imprudent, inexpedient or impossible to conduct the affairs of the county at the regular or usual place of business in the courthouse within the City of Milwaukee, the county board, upon all of the presiding officer or his/her

successor, shall assemble and meet at any place within or without the territorial limits of the county pursuant to ch. 323.166, Wis. Stats. Said meeting place is hereby designated to be the alternate or substitute as a temporary emergency location for the conduct and transaction of all public business by the county board, and other officers of the county shall exercise as such location pursuant to ch. 323.166, Wis. Stats., all of the executive, legislative, administrative and judicial powers and functions conferred upon this governing body and officers by or under the laws of this state, and all acts of this governing body and officers shall be valid and binding as if performed within the territorial limits of the county.

Section 99.085 - Intent and policy; definitions; assistance to other agencies; sheriff's duties.

(1) *Declaration of policy.* It is the intent of the county board to implement and comply with ss. 59.54(2) 59.07(42) and 59.27(11) 59.23(44), Wis. Stats., and thereby appropriate money for the purchase of boats and other equipment allowing the sheriff to conduct operations in county waters for the rescue of human beings and recovery of human bodies.

(2) *Definitions.* "Emergencies" shall be defined as events arising out of a natural or civil disaster as declared by the governor, the directives of the county executive sheriff, or resolutions, ordinances or other pronouncements of the county board as provided in section 99.04 of this chapter.

(3) *Requests from other governmental agencies.* When, pursuant to s. 59.28(2) 59.24(2), Wis. Stats., the sheriff receives an order or request to assist other law enforcement agencies, municipal, state and federal, in search and rescue operations, the sheriff may respond with such assistance without a formal declaration of emergency, as provided in subsection (2) of this section.

(4) *Sheriff to implement.*

(a) The sheriff is directed to designate adequate personnel to act as standby alert for subsurface and surface rescue and recovery operations and is directed to provide an adequate training program for such personnel.

(b) ~~He/She~~ The sheriff is further ordered to maintain and preserve the equipment for rescue and recovery

in a good and usable condition.

(c) The sheriff is further directed to request the county board for proper budgetary appropriations for the operation of this standby program.

Section 2. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication.
