Flood-Control Project Will Give Estabrook Park a Waterfall and Dam



A SEVEN-FOOT artificial waterfall will be added to Estabrook park with the construction of a new dam below the Fort Washington rd. as a flood-control measure and to increase the park's recreational facilities. Work will start with CCC labor within two weeks, according to county officials. The spillway (left) will be faced with stones, simulating a natural cascade. An artificial channel will be dredged (right) and closed with manually-operated gates. The island will be composed of part of the now existing river bank. Above the floodgates is a series of concrete posts, to guide ice flows away from the gates and over the spillway.
