- Establish statewide police use of force standards which emphasize the primary duty of law enforcement is to preserve the life of all
- Requires police agencies to maintain employee files which must be reviewed by other police agencies or jails prior to hiring to prevent bad officers from moving from department to department
- Creates a civil cause of action for unnecessarily summoning law enforcement officers
- Protect police whistleblowers
- Prohibit the use of chokeholds
- Prohibit no-knock search warrants
