





An I-94 expansion gets money. Old Loomis, Jackson Park Drive, Bradford Beach parking lot gets money. All of these hardly critical projects serve to drain our budget at the expense of the clearly defined goals of the county for climate, transit, and budget sustainability. Please don't divert the CN2 ARPA dollars to other routine maintenance. We are facing serious budgetary issues, and using ARPA money to patch regular maintenance holes only delays the hard decisions you should have made around the sales tax discussions. Since that time has passed, these discussions need to happen now

without taking the easy out and spending down the ARPA money.

Please reconsider using this money to continue the study or otherwise bolster the bus service in meaningful ways. Perhaps purchasing infrastructure like bus-bulbs that can improve the performance of the system, while also increasing rider safety. Or get UMO on the line to figure out why we still can't use tap to pay and why their app is so abysmally designed and hostile. Regular riders can tell you a laundry list of issues that make the bus system less efficient or less effective, but a significant one is our inability to work proactively with MKE and other munis to make sure the streets aren't designed in ways that constantly punish bus riders. Ride a bus long enough and you'll surely see a driver waiting patiently as passing cars refuse to yield to let them in, or worse, cut off the bus causing them to lurch to a stop to avoid collisions.

If there is any data we can get out of a study, surely it will help us optimize and make smarter decisions about how we adapt going forward and in future service expansion efforts.

While I am an ardent supporter and user of transit, once MCTS eschewed center running on S 27th and Layton Blvd in this project, overriding the recommendations of the earlier planning process, this project became deeply flawed.

Given the length, ridership potential and central-ness of this corridor the county should talk about an RTA and plan for an automated metro line, like Vancouver - a city that was smaller than Milwaukee when theirs was constructed. Such a line would revolutionize transit in Milwaukee by tying together numerous other routes and modes and be truly competitive with driving.

Milwaukee needs to design a cohesive transit network, with one entity (An RTA structured akin to German Verkehrsverbund :<https://stewartmader.com/verkehrsverbund-how-transit-agencies-in-germany-harmonize-the-customer-experience/>) designing it, managing fares, schedules, branding, etc.






