

# Milwaukee County Area Agency on Aging 2024 Year in Review

The Milwaukee County **Area Agency on Aging** supports a network of services for older adults that enhance their ability to lead healthy, meaningful, engaged, and dignified lives in their communities.

12,958 unduplicated Milwaukee County older adult residents served in 2024.

#### **Administration & Outreach**

- Developed 2025-2027 Area Aging Plan with the Commission on Aging and Aging Advisory Council.
- Responded to needs of a growing older adult population using Older Americans Act ARPA funds for Financial, Employment, and Tech counseling, Home Repair, Transportation, and senior centers.
- Hosted the 2024 Aging Network Summit: Powered by Connection, Building a Livable Community
  bringing together 110 partners from across the aging network to improve aging services.
- Hosted US DHHS Deputy Secretary and the Director, Center for Medicare at Wilson senior center to educate residents on new healthcare benefits available under the Inflation Reduction Act.
- Conducted Request for Proposals and updated Program Guidelines for Milwaukee County Senior
   Center Programming, Catering for Senior Dining, and Specialized Transportation services.
- Improved data collection and transitioned to new PeerPlace system required by Wisconsin DHS.
- Developed new Social Support, Nutrition, and Caregiver Support brochures and translated client facing materials into twelve (12) languages.
- Led project reviewing all webpages and posted materials and upgraded website to increase
  accessibility for persons with disabilities and comply with Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act.

# **Advocacy**

- Held in-person Senior Leadership program for 12 new senior leaders with state and federal legislative partners, Aging advocacy leaders, the County Board and Commission on Aging.
- Hosted an "In-District Legislative Meet & Greet" with the Commission on Aging at Wilson senior center bringing together aging advocates with local, state, and federal representatives to discuss public policy.
- Provided comments supporting the Older Americans Act reauthorization, the Strategic Framework for a National Plan on Aging, and helped lead a statewide initiative to Reframe Aging in Wisconsin.
- Provided Medicare education through 44 in-person Medicare 101 presentations, including Native American and Spanish language sessions, and individual counseling for 661 Medicare recipients.
- Initiated monthly Advocacy e-News Service. Sent Medicare Counseling mailer to 82,000 households.

# **Social Support and Transportation Services**

- Expanded Serving Older Adults of SE Wisconsin's Tech Connect program to decrease isolation for 453
  low-income older adults living in senior housing by providing free devices and increasing resident's
  capacity to utilize virtual technology to connect with other Older American Act programming.
- Provided older adults 476 hours of professional therapy through the Late Life Counseling project.
- Secured Americorps Senior Companions program grant after Social Development Commission suspended services. Hired coordinator and put in place policies and administrative safeguards.
- Hosted 46 free docent-led tours with OATS rides to cultural and recreational sites including the Milwaukee County Domes, Zoo, Wehr Nature Center, and Boerner Botanical Gardens.
- Secured **eight new accessible vehicles** through an FTA 5310 grant for the OATS program and successfully reapplied for 2025-26 funding to support Transportation Coordination.

#### **Senior Nutrition**

- Expanded **Dine-Out** program by adding a fifth minority owned restaurant **Ruby J's**; attracted **626 new diners**, 89% of whom were persons of color.
- Utilizing an evidence-based malnutrition screening tool, provided individualized nutrition counseling to 317 Meals on Wheels recipients, reducing malnutrition risk up to 90%.
- Volunteers at 19 daily congregate dining sites and the Dine out program provided 26,557 hours
  in support of the Senior Nutrition Program.

# **Community Health & Wellness**

- Distributed 11,914 COVID test kits to community partners and administered 3566 COVID vaccines,
   2905 flu vaccines, and 712 other vaccines through the Aging and Disability Vaccination Collaborative.
- Expanded the Aging and Disability Vaccination Collaborative to add Outreach Community Health Center, the Hmong American Friendship Association, and Hayat Pharmacies, with HCl and InPower.
- Hosted Social Wealth for Mental Health community health fair with Milwaukee County Behavioral Health to address social isolation and loneliness and address rise of suicide rate among older adults.
- Initiated Rx Social Connect with the Medical College of Wisconsin School of Pharmacy, Pharmacy
  Society of Wisconsin, and Hayat Pharmacies, training pharmacists to screen for isolation and loneliness
  among older patients and refer them to social programming through Vital Voices for Mental Health.
- Expanded capacity of the **Walk With Ease** program, including five new facilitators with partners from Aurora, Franklin Health Department, Luther Manor and two community volunteers.

# **Caregiver Support**

- Hosted 16 community events and participated in 30 outreach events to provide information and support to caregivers, including four with the Wisconsin Alzheimer's Institute in communities of color.
- Provided 126 National Family Caregiver Support grants and 102 Alzheimer's Family Caregiver Support grants, a 47% increase in households served from 2023.
- Assisted developing statewide plan to implement the National Strategy to Support Family Caregivers,
   the State Dementia Plan, and co-founded the Milwaukee Coalition for African-American Caregivers.

#### **Senior Centers**

- 94% of older adult participants surveyed stated the programs and activities at the Milwaukee County senior centers helped them combat isolation and increased their connections to others.
- Renovated the Washington Park senior center to include a new demonstration kitchen; health clinic at Wilson senior center, and LED lighting at all five Milwaukee County senior centers.
- Secured \$4.1 million Flexible Facilities grant to improve broadband connectivity, accessibility, telehealth, and dining services at the Clinton Rose senior center.



315,835 Meals on Wheels delivered to home-bound older adults.

**228,479** Meals served by take-out, at Dine-Out restaurants, and at congregate meal sites.



**61,493** Rides provided through AAA Older Adult Transportation Services, United Community Center & ERAS Volunteer Drivers.



**55** Evidence Based Health Promotion Program sessions held with **307 participants**.



**5535** residents participating in Milwaukee County senior centers.



**557** residents receive **4004** hours of legal advice and representation through SeniorLAW.
