- A. DHHS is requesting authorization to amend three fee-for-service (FFS) agreements for Group Home Providers (GH). Original 2025 contracts for 22 FFS agreements were for \$99,000 each for a total of \$2,178,000 and each contract was amended in the May cycle (Report 25-321) to \$250,000 each for a total increase of \$3,322,000. The three additional requested contract increases total \$500,000 over current amended amounts.

There are also five Residential Treatment Center (RTC) agreements that require additional funding based on actuals and projected usage through 2025. The requested increase totals of \$6,550,000 over current amended amounts to ensure sufficient funding through the end of 2025.

Lastly, there is one clinical service contract for youth staying in the detention center that is projected to require an additional \$21,000 in funding based on actuals and projected usage through 2025.

- B. Approval of this request will enable CYFS to amend 2025 contracts based on 2025 utilization. Actual costs for each contract will depend on the number of youth ordered to out-of-home care and the facilities that the court chooses for each placement. Due to the youth being court ordered to these programs, CYFS is required to enter into a contract with the facility and oversee the placement of the youth (DOC 938.36).
- C. The total anticipated cost for both the GH and RTC contracts is now about \$13 million which reflects an increase of about \$4.7 million over the 2025 Budget. The budget included \$8.3 million for out of home care. As mentioned in May, about 70% of this increased amount is due

to increased GH and RTC daily rates which are set by the state and the remaining 30% of the increase is due to increased utilization. The additional \$21,000 in clinical services was included in the 2025 budget.

At this time, the fiscal projection for CYFS anticipates absorbing this increased out-of-home care cost within the existing 2025 budget due to savings from lower DOC correctional placements and reduced cost of placements at Mendota, Lincoln Hills and Copper Lake. The period 9 projection anticipates just over a \$99,000 surplus which includes this additional cost.

D. This fiscal note assumes that the total contract amounts for each provider is sufficient for 2025 placement needs. Actual contract amounts will depend on 2025 utilization which is difficult to predict accurately. This fiscal note also assumes a 15% increase in FFS costs for 2026.
