SUBJECT: INTEGRATION OF ADOPTED MUNICIPAL WARDS INTO MILWAUKEE COUNTY SUPERVISORY DISTRICT PLAN

On November 1, 2021, following adoption by the Board of Supervisors, County Executive David C. Crowley signed the Resolution associated with File No. 21-994, which set forth the Tentative Supervisory District Plan for the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors and allowed that Plan to be formally transmitted by staff to the 19 cities and villages that are at least partially within Milwaukee County. These municipalities then began the process of drawing revised wards (as needed) based on changes in population since 2010, impacts on existing wards of the adopted Tentative Supervisory District Plan, and other factors such as communities or neighborhoods of interest. As permitted under County Ordinance, six communities requested assistance through the Independent Redistricting Committee (IRC) process, and such assistance was provided by the Commission staff by following the guidance previously provided by the IRC. These six communities were the Cities of Glendale and Wauwatosa, and the Villages of Brown Deer, Fox Point, Shorewood, and Whitefish Bay.

MUNICIPAL WARD ADOPTION PROCESS

Wisconsin Statutes require all municipal wards, dependent on total community population as of the latest available Decennial U.S. Census data, to fall within specific population ranges, and that due consideration be given to known future population changes as well. In addition, the Wisconsin Statutes require that municipalities make a "good faith effort" to accommodate the County's Tentative Supervisory District boundaries in the drawing of their revised wards. As of the writing of this memorandum, the 19 municipalities completed or are anticipated to have completed their ward-drawing efforts on the dates listed below:

The required population ranges for municipal wards, the district boundaries of other entities such as school districts or the municipality's common council, or considerations related to communities and neighborhoods of interest may require a municipality to adopt wards that result in a need for modifications to the adopted Tentative Supervisory District Plan. During this redistricting cycle, the Cities of Glendale, Greenfield, Milwaukee, and West Allis adopted ward plans that necessitate small changes be made to the adopted Tentative Supervisory District Plan. These changes are highlighted in the series of maps in Attachment A to this memorandum.

FINAL SUPERVISORY DISTRICT PLAN ADOPTION


Wisconsin Statutes indicate that the adopted municipal wards "shall govern the adjustment" of the adopted Tentative Supervisory District Plan during the Final Supervisory District Plan adoption stage of the redistricting process. Given this, Commission staff have prepared a draft Final Supervisory District Plan map, draft Final Supervisory District Plan data tables, and an online interactive map of the draft Final Supervisory District Plan. These three items are available through the County Legislative Information Center via File No. 21-1091. The Commission appreciates the opportunity to assist the County with this important effort.

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




Area 1 - Change to 2021 Tentative Supervisory District Plan




