

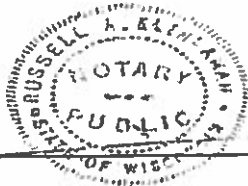

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Milwaukee does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 47.32 of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is hereby amended as follows:

47.32. - Admission charges and parking fees at the county zoo and Mitchell Park Conservatory.

(a) Any changes to admission charges at the Mitchell Park Conservatory shall be approved by the county board. Current fees will be published in the adopted county budget each year.

Admission fees are waived for county residents on Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's. There will be one (1) free day per month for both county and non-county residents, from January through March, and in October, November, and December. In all instances, parking fees will continue to be charged.~~
