


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

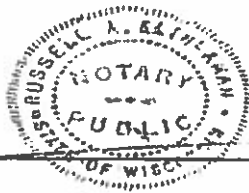

AN ORDINANCE

The Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors of the County of Milwaukee does enact as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 101 of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

301. - Appointment of county board.

(1) Establishment of independent advisory. Independent redistricting committee. In order to maintain the integrity of the redistricting process and to mitigate any conflicts of interest or claims of partiality, an independent redistricting committee (IRC) shall be established by the County Board and shall be initially appointed in accordance with the final published results of the 2020 Federal Decennial Census and every census thereafter to develop all subsequent decennial redistricting plans for Milwaukee County.

(2) Composition of committee. County supervisory districts are hereby established so as to represent as closely as practicable an equal number of persons, but maintaining such other factors as consistency, compactness, contiguity, and integrity of existing village and city limits and precincts wherever possible and with the predominant objective of achieving as nearly as and good faith effort to create five groups of possible equal population distribution among all districts.

(a) Committee criteria. The IRC's redistricting plan shall comply with the following criteria:

- (1) Federal equal population mandates.
- (2) Preexisting criteria established by local and state laws.
- (3) Maintenance of voting rights of Hispanic and African American and other citizens as guaranteed in the Voting Rights Act of 1965.
- (4) A map that consists of districts that best serve the integrity of existing neighborhoods and communities of interest within Milwaukee County.

(b) Members. The IRC shall be composed of six (6) voting judges appointed by the county board and confirmed by the County Board, who are familiar with Milwaukee County, and maintain a Wisconsin law license in good standing.

(c) Comment period for community groups. There shall be a comment period of no less than sixty (60) days for specified community groups to submit written feedback regarding the appointment to the county board chairperson's office. The county board chairperson shall send copies of the submitted IRC members' resumes and appointment letters to the following organizations no less than sixty (60) days prior to confirmation:

- (1) Marquette University Law School
- (2) University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee School of Public Administration
- (3) The Hispanic Chamber of Commerce
- (4) The Milwaukee Urban League
- (5) The Public Policy Forum
- (6) The Intergovernmental Cooperation Council of Milwaukee County
- (7) The League of Women Voters
- (8) The NAACP
- (9) Voters On the Frontlines.

(d) Expenses. Milwaukee County shall provide an accessible meeting space and all necessary funding for the committee to complete its task at a level consistent with the financial support to pay the Southwestern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (SWRPC) to provide the necessary technical assistance and mapping services as determined by the IRC to carry out its objective.

(e) Compensation. Members of the IRC shall be compensated in the amount of the standard rate (E.C. 010.10), or a comparable rate of those who serve on similar public committees. This compensation shall only be offered for services rendered during the time in which the decennial redistricting process occurs.

(3) Appointment of supervisory districts. Eighteen (18) supervisory districts are hereby established as the county supervisory districts for the spring primary in February 2022 and spring election in April 2022 and are to remain in effect until the 2020 federal decennial population census is certified, or unless, and until the number of supervisory districts changes. A county board resolution will be submitted in accordance with the certification of the 2020 federal decennial population census and thereafter to reflect the number of supervisory districts established in the recommended county-wide map.

(4) Process. The IRC shall be appointed no later than July 1 in the year 2021, the end of September in the year 2020, 2020 and a every decennial period thereafter:

(a) The IRC will convene as soon as practicable after the U.S. decennial census data is prepared and available to the county. The IRC may elect to convene prior to the publication of the U.S. decennial census data. The IRC will meet to review and discuss the results of the U.S. decennial census data until a first draft of a county redistricting map is presented to the county board, no later than May of the year after appointment.

(b) Adoption of the map by the county board shall be by a simple majority of the supervisors then seated. The map and any subsequent drafts prepared by the IRC shall be voted on by the county board.

(c) If the county board does not adopt the proposed map within thirty (30) days the map shall return to the IRC for review and reworking of a second draft meeting public and elected official comment.

(d) The IRC's second draft of a map, if any, shall be returned to the county board within twenty (20) days of the county board's receipt of the proposed second draft map within ten (10) days, the map shall return to the IRC for review and reworking of a third draft meeting public and elected official comment.

(e) The IRC's third draft of the map, if any, shall be returned to the county board within ten (10) days. If the county board does not adopt the proposed third draft map within ten (10) days, the county board shall proceed to develop and adopt a map directly without further IRC input. Following the adoption of a map under (5) (2)(a) shall, shall, and thereafter, occur.

Section 2. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication.
