


Objectives

- Provide incarceration and post incarceration support
- Utilize evidence-based principles
- Focus on individuals convicted of violent and/or gun related offenses
- Promote positive changes in the lives of the residents
 - Beginning pre-release through 12 months post-release
- Gain support of community and family members



Holistic Approach







Goals

- Identify drivers of violent behavior
- Provide support services to address those needs
- Reduce recidivism- create safer communities
- Implement Evidence-Based Mentoring program
- Connect residents with post release services
- Track data to determine impact

Program Criteria for Participants

Must be assessed at medium to high-risk to reoffend

Must have conviction of gun-related or violent offense

Must be sentenced to House of Correction

Must have 120 days or greater to serve



Facility Programming- 90 Days

Daily programming

Menu of programming based on specific risk and needs

Cognitive and Restorative Justice Programming will be considered CORE programming

Residents will be housed in same dorm to provide support and build new skills

Correctional Staff will be handpicked

Program participation will be incentivized



Projected Timeline

- RFP Process: 4-6 months
- Negotiate with vendor who won bid: 1-2 months
- Receive Board approval: 1-2 months
- Receive signatures: 1-2 months
- Approved vendor will hire staff: 3 months
- Enrollment will then be able to begin and last for 12 months
- Then there will be additional 12 month follow up services provided post-release

Fiscal Effect

- 1.0 FTE Project Manager- \$60,000
- 2.0 FTE Resident Service Coordinators- \$91,000
- .25 FTE Data Analyst \$12,000
- Contract with Credible Messenger- \$500,000



Contract with Credible Messenger

- \$47-\$123 Social Benefit Cost Ratio saved for every \$1 spent on the program model, 10k total program expenditure per participant for 50 participants
- 1 full time admin
- 4 full time staff
- 2 part time staff
- Support Services \$350/participant total: \$17,500
- Driver's license program \$125/participant total: \$6,250
- Participant tracing and data warehousing software: \$1,500
- Total Cost: \$688,250
