1 File No. 22-418 2 3 From the County Executive, requesting emergency allocation of American Rescue Plan 4 Act funding to bolster Milwaukee County's behavioral health efforts. 5 6 **A RESOLUTION** 7 8 WHEREAS, Milwaukee County has seen a recent, serious uptick in gun violence, 9 substance abuse, and other mental health issues; and 10 11 WHEREAS, Milwaukee County recognizes that these issues are symptoms of 12 underlying root causes; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Milwaukee County is committed to moving resources upstream and dealing 15 with the root causes of violence, substance abuse, and other mental health issues; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Human Services and Parks Department 18 have proposed several uses of funding from the American Rescue Plan Act funding that 19 would attempt to address those root causes; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the Credible Messenger Program identifies high-risk youth, ages 13-20, at 22 the center of gun violence, provides them with seven-days-a-week mentoring and 23 supportive relationships using credible messengers and delivers services and supports 24 to these individuals, and 25 26 WHEREAS, the Trauma Response Program will fund additional community crisis beds 27 to assist with non-police responses to crisis calls, and would be used to fund the 28 emergency beds/housing options as well as crisis response staff; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the Behavioral Health Awareness Campaign would create a public 31 awareness campaign about mental health (and/or DHHS-wide) services available. This 32 is specifically in response to promotion and increasing awareness about non-law 33 enforcement related and preventative/upstream services in BHD. This is also related to 34 promotion of No Wrong Door (Children's & Adult Integration projects). Increased 35 awareness continues to be a need as mental health and public safety issues increase 36 through the pandemic; and 37 38 WHEREAS, the Safer Milwaukee Support Proposal provides support for non-law 39 enforcement crisis response pilot suggested in "Safer MKE" proposal. Long term 40 sustainability plan can include braided funding from grants and Medicaid reimbursable 41 services as well as city/county funds. These efforts would increase support for mental 42 health and public safety priorities; and 43 44 WHEREAS, the Safe Routes to Parks program is a targeted investment to improve

pedestrian safety and deter reckless driving in and near Milwaukee County Parks by providing safety measures like curb extensions, raised crosswalks, crosswalk painting

and signage, as well as collaboration with the City of Milwaukee to improve City rights of way; and

WHEREAS, the Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design is an urban design strategy that focuses on addressing aspects of the built environment in order to deter criminal activity and promote public safety through placement and alignment of physical improvements, such as alteration of existing landscaping and physical elements of parks, improvement of park lighting to improve visibility, installation of motion sensor lighting controls on buildings, and the removal and regrading of vacant facilities.

WHEREAS, the DHHS proposals included herein were being considered by the ARPA Task Force through their normal process, however, the urgent need for violence and harm reduction strategies in the current atmosphere necessitates expedited consideration of these requests, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors authorizes the use of \$6,704,500 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds for (1) Department of Health and Human Services, Children, Youth, and Family Services Credible Messenger Program in the amount of \$1,201,200; (2) Department of Health and Human Services, Housing Division's Trauma Response program in the amount of \$1,971,200; (3) Department of Health and Human Services Behavioral Health Awareness Campaign in the amount of \$545,600; (4) Department of Health and Human Services, Safer Milwaukee Proposal Support in the amount of \$550,000; (5) Parks Department Safe Routes to Parks Program, in the amount of \$1,287,000; and (6) Parks Department Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design program in the amount of \$1,149,500; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Office of Strategy, Budget and Performance and the Office of the Comptroller are authorized and directed to provide an administrative appropriation transfer to recognize \$6,704,500 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, and to allocate funds to the appropriate departments accounts to provide for the programs described herein; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that funds will be allocated for contract and accounting staff support DHHS in administering these additional resources.
