8 9	WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Zoo (Zoo) is one of the top four attractions, and largest cultural institution in Wisconsin (the State); and
10	
11	WHEREAS, in a typical non-Coronavirus Disease year, the Zoo is visited by over
12	1.2 million people, and it is one of the area's most popular attractions for families and
13	animal lovers of all ages for the surrounding communities and out-of-state visitors; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, according to the Association of Zoos and Aquariums demographic
16	study, over 183 million people in the United States, and over 200 million world-wide visit
17	accredited zoo facilities annually, more than the National Football League, National
18	Basketball Association, National Hockey League, and Major League Baseball annual
19	attendance combined; and
20	WHEREAS on October 7, 2021, the State Department of Administration
21	WHEREAS, on October 7, 2021, the State Department of Administration announced funds available from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to provide
22 23	grants to local governments and tourism-entity nonprofits, for tourism-related investment
23 24	projects that help promote, maintain, or bolster Wisconsin's tourism industry and that
24 25	have a substantial capital component; and

20 27	WHEREAS, since the Zoo is a leading Milwaukee and State tourism destination,
28	an application was submitted on November 19, 2021, to renovate the Humboldt
29	Penguin Exhibit (the Exhibit); and
30	
31	WHEREAS, on February 2, 2021, notification was received that the Zoo's
32	application was selected at the maximum funding level of \$3.5 million; and
33	
34	WHEREAS, the focus of the State grant will accommodate an expansion of the
35	pool to create an engaging, nose-to-nose interaction for visitors as well as some
36	upgrades to the life support systems; and
37	
38	WHEREAS, the Zoo submitted a Milwaukee County (the County) ARPA
39	application for the February 4, 2022 deadline, requesting \$3,760,828 to supplement the
40	State grant, to accommodate the full scope reconstruction of the Exhibit as estimated by
41	the Architecture, Engineering, and Environmental Services Section, Facilities
42	Management Division, Department of Administrative Services; and

WHEREAS, the State Tourism Capital Grant, and any additional County ARPA 44 funds will help the Zoo meet its mission to continue to inspire public understanding, 45 support, and participation in global conservation of animal species and their 46 environment by creating a unifying bond between visitors and the living earth, and will 47 provide an environment for personal renewal and enjoyment for quests; and 48 49 WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance, at its meeting of March 17, 2022, 50 recommended adoption of File No. 22-335 (vote 7-0); now, therefore, 51 52 BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby 53 authorizes the Director, Milwaukee County Zoo, to accept the \$3.5 million State of 54 Wisconsin Tourism Capital Grant; and 55 56 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Director, Office of Strategy, Budget, and 57 Performance (OSBP), in cooperation with the Office of the Comptroller (Comptroller), is 58 hereby authorized to process an appropriation transfer to recognize \$3.5 million in grant 59 funds, and establish expenditure authority of \$3.5 million to carry out the grant for the 60 Humboldt Penguin Exhibit (the Exhibit); and 61 62 63 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Director, OSBP, and the Comptroller, are authorized to process an appropriation transfer to recognize any additional Milwaukee 64 County American Rescue Plan Act funds that may be awarded and establish 65 expenditure authority for the reconstruction of the Exhibit. 66 67 68 69 srb 70 03/17/2022 71 S:\Committees\2022\March\FINANCE\Resolutions\22-335 Zoo - WI Tourism Grant.docx
