19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, the resolution in File No. 21-1085 "reauthorizes the vaccine incentive program established and funded in File No. 21-632 to continue in 2022 from the unused funds previously appropriated" to terminate on December 31, 2022 or upon exhaustion of allotted funds, whichever occurs sooner; and
232425262728	WHEREAS, the Office of the Sheriff reports that only awarding \$50 for only a single vaccine dose has resulted in consternation at the HOC and County Jail/Criminal Justice Facility (CJF), and the policy as originally developed in File No. 21-632 had not envisioned the social public health benefit to COVID-19 booster shots; and
29 30 31 32 33	WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Human Services – Division of Youth and Family Services (DHHS-DYFS) would also like to provide \$50 incentives (e.g. gift cards) to youths held in the Youth Detention Center located at the Vel R. Phillips Youth and Family Justice Center for receiving a COVID-19 vaccination or booster shot; and
34 35 36	WHEREAS, to avoid the appearance of unfairness and hasten the necessity for extraordinary COVID-19 measures, it is critical to get as many people vaccinated as possible; and
37 38	WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance, at its meeting of March 17, 2022,

recommended adoption of File No. 22-431 (vote 7-0); now, therefore

39 40 BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby supersedes the policy originally established in File No. 21-632 and continued in 21-1085, thereby allowing the existing appropriation of funds to be granted in \$50 increments to those occupants of the House of Correction (HOC) and County Jail/Criminal Justice Facility (CJF) who have received their second dose of a two-dose vaccine and/or a COVID-19 booster shot in addition to the primary dose, when receiving the shot is appropriate, until the existing appropriation is exhausted; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Department of Health and Human Services - Division of Youth and Family Services (DHHS-DYFS) is authorized to provide \$50 incentives, such as gift cards, to youths held in the Youth Detention Center located at the Vel R. Phillips Youth and Family Justice Center for receiving a COVID-19 vaccination or booster shot; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this policy shall extend retroactively to the adoption of File No. 21-632 for those who have remained in the HOC and/or CJF.
