11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) is a legislative program that was authorized in Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act, the Federal transportation act that was signed into law on December 4, 2015; and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, TAP projects expand travel choice, strengthen the local economy, improve the quality of life, and protect the environment by supporting non-traditional projects linked to the transportation system; and
19 20 21	WHEREAS, TAP grants are very competitive and projects must commence within four years of the award date; and
22 23 24 25 26 27	WHEREAS, the purpose of the TAP application submission project named "Pedestrian and Bicycle Crossing Planning Assessment (the Project)", is to investigate existing pedestrian/bicycle crossings (up to 20) on County Trunk Highways (CTH) throughout Milwaukee County (the County), and create a prioritized plan for pedestrian/bicycle crossing enhancements; and
28 29 30 31	WHEREAS, the Project will review select crossings (up to 20) that have not been recently reviewed that are well used, have concerns with safety, or have received concerns from the public in the past; and
32 33 34 35	WHEREAS, a report will be compiled containing a prioritized list, improvement alternatives / recommendations, and construction cost estimates for candidate pedestrian/bicycle crossings implementation projects; and
36 37 38 39	WHEREAS, overall, the report will be used by the Department of Transportation to determine where to prioritize implementation to take advantage of subsequent future TAP grant funding; and
40 41 42	WHEREAS, 14 pedestrian/bicycle crossings that connect to bus routes, trails, parks, or schools will be reviewed in the Project, along with six additional locations that will be determined during the Project; and

43 44 WHEREAS, TAP is a reimbursement program that is funded 80 percent 45 Federally, with a 20 percent local share (County), and Federal funds are capped at the 46 award amount; and 47 48 WHEREAS, the TAP Projects will allow the County to provide enhancements / 49 improvements that support health equity, by applying a racial equity lens to 50 pedestrian/bicycle crossings on CTH throughout the County, utilizing 80 percent Federal 51 funding to enhance fiscal health; and 52 53 WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance, at its meeting of March 17, 2022, 54 recommended adoption of File No. 22-381 (vote 7-0); 55 now, therefore, 56 57 BE IT RESOLVED, one Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) application 58 has been submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation to meet the 59 deadline of January 28, 2022, for the 2022-2026 program cycle, and the TAP grant will 60 not be awarded until a Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors' resolution is passed by 61 the deadline of April 18, 2022, authorizing subsequent TAP applications to be submitted 62 separately, based on the alternatives / recommendations resulting from the TAP 63 application/project submitted; and 64 65 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if TAP grants are awarded to the County for the 66 one TAP project and its subsequent TAP projects, the Department of Transportation is 67 authorized to execute administrative fund transfers, and/or capital improvement 68 budgets, to implement the awarded grant funding. 69 70 71 72 73 srb 03/17/2022 \\Fi01wpchc\comclerk\$\Committees\2022\March\FINANCE\Resolutions\22-381 TAP grant acceptance.docx
