 Open Data is published and freely available on the Internet.

 Open Data can be easily accessed, sorted, shared, and used.

 Open Data allows for more efficient governance and widespread innovation.

What is Open Data?

- Open Data is non-sensitive data.
- No personal information is included.
- Automatically published online.

Why Open Data? (1 of 2)

- Open Data is part of a modern, transparent, open government.
- Increases public trust and involvement.
- Reduces staff time lost to ORRs.

Why Open Data? (2 of 2)

- Transparency and democratic control
- Participation
- Self-empowerment
- Improved or new private products and services
- Spurring innovation
- Improved efficiency of government services
- Improved effectiveness of government services
- Impact measurement of policies
- New knowledge from combined data sources and patterns in large data volumes

 - Overdose Data from M.E., MCW

This resolution's effects:

- Commits Milwaukee Co. to Open Data.
- IMSD shall develop administrative guidelines for a technical platform for an Open Data Portal.
- Requests All County depts. to support the concept and plan to use Open Data.
- Follow-up report in September 2022.
