AN ENGROSSED RESOLUTION

Authorizing and directing the Office of Strategy, Budget, and Performance to transfer \$100,000 from Org. Unit 1940-1945 – Appropriation for Contingencies to Org. Unit 8000 - Department of Health and Human Services to allow the Children, Youth, and Family Services Division to enter into an agreement with the ONE Milwaukee Taskforce to help disrupt and dismantle the school to prison pipeline in Milwaukee County

WHEREAS, the term "school to prison pipeline" is often used to explain how youth that experience excessive suspensions or expulsions in school become involved in the criminal justice system; and

WHEREAS, U.S. News and World, reports that data shows that Black and Hispanic students are suspended and expelled at higher rates than White students, and as adults, they are disproportionately represented in the prison system; and

WHEREAS, researchers from Boston University, the University of Boulder Colorado, and Harvard University published a report titled *Proving the School-to-Prison Pipeline* and concluded that early increases in misbehavior at school cause an increase in crime in adult years; and

WHEREAS, data from the report specifically cites that students assigned to stricter middle schools are 3.2 percentage points more likely to have been arrested and 2.5 percentage points more likely to be incarcerated as adults; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Human Services, Children, Youth, and Family Services Division (CYFSD) is committed to youth justice reform and healing the childhood trauma that youth in Milwaukee County have experienced; and

WHEREAS, CYFSD approaches youth justice reform through the lens of evidence-based trauma-informed individualized care in the least restrictive setting with support from families, credible messengers, and community stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, in June 2020, Milwaukee Public Schools took action to terminate contracts with the Milwaukee Police Department for School Resource Officers and the purchasing of criminalizing equipment to combat the school to prison pipeline; and

 WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukee has adopted several initiatives to deter the school to prison pipeline such as Black Male Achievement, Milwaukee Promise Zones, Public Safety Action Plan, and more; and

WHEREAS, in February 2020, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors adopted File No. 20-137 creating the ONE Milwaukee Taskforce, a joint task force with the City of Milwaukee and Milwaukee Public Schools to collaborate and leverage resources to improve the lives of residents in Milwaukee; and

WHEREAS, the ONE Milwaukee Taskforce can collaborate with CYFSD to leverage resources to build a roadmap to dismantle the school to prison pipeline in Milwaukee County; and

WHEREAS, the school to prison pipeline, which puts youth at substantial risk of dropping out of high school and being admitted into the criminal justice system, needs to be disrupted; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Health Equity, Human Needs, and Strategic Planning, at its meeting of March 16, 2022, recommended adoption of File No. 22-308 (vote 5-0); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the ONE Milwaukee Taskforce is requested to work in conjunction with the Department of Health and Human Services, Children, Youth and Family Services Division to create a comprehensive plan to combat the school to prison pipeline in Milwaukee County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Office of Strategy, Budget, and Performance is authorized and directed to transfer \$100,000 from Org. Unit 1940-1945 – Appropriation for Contingencies to <u>an allocated contingency account in</u> the Department of Health and Human Services, Org. Unit 8000, account <u>74301 78951</u> to allow the Department to <u>establish weigh and shape an a proposed</u> agreement with the ONE Milwaukee Taskforce, <u>subject to future Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors approval</u>; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the ONE Milwaukee Taskforce, in conjunction with the Children, Youth, and Family Services Division shall present a written report to the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors for consideration in the June 2022 meeting cycle that outlines the progress on the development of a comprehensive plan to dismantle the school to prison pipeline and deter children and youth from entering the school to prison pipeline; and

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon completion of the proposed plan, the Department of Health and Human Services will identify needs generated from the plan to the County Board of Supervisors for review and approval to release a commensurate amount of funding held in an allocated contingency account to effectuate the plan.
