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78	SECTION 1. Section 106.01 of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is hereby
79	amended as follows:
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81	106.01 Purpose.
82	The Milwaukee County Commission on Youth is created to serve as a
83	representative body for youth in Milwaukee County government. The commission shall
84	work in partnership with the county board and, the county executive, the community of
85	promise advisory council and the state agency Alliance for Wisconsin Youth to
86	serve and advance the interests of Milwaukee County youth <u>, make advisory</u>
87	recommendations about policy and budgetary decisions to the Milwaukee County
88	Board of Supervisors, and to advance the county's mission of achieving racial
89	equity.
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- 91 **SECTION 2.** Section 106.03 of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is hereby amended as follows: 92
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94 106.03. - Selection of commissioners.

- 95 (1) Application. A candidate for the commission on youth may must request an
- 96 application from his or her county board supervisor, the county executive, or 97 access it on the county website. Completed applications shall be submitted to 98 the county executive's office where they shall be retained until requested by the 99 selection committee. The commission has sole authority to determine when 100 applications may be submitted.
- 101 (2) Selection committee. Upon adoption of this ordinance, an initial selection 102 committee shall be created to select the first youth commissioners. The initial 103 selection committee will consist of two adults and three youth (age 18 or under)
- 104 who will be jointly appointed by the county executive and the county board 105 chairman chairperson. The initial selection committee shall review all
- 106 applications by utilizing published criteria and interview prospective
- 107 commissioners. The initial selection committee shall submit the names of the 108 first commissioners to the county board for confirmation. Once seated, the
- 109 commission on youth will appoint from within its ranks a selection committee of
- 110 not less than five (5) commissioners. The selection committee will determine 111 when applications may be submitted, conduct application reviews, interview
- 112 candidates, and submit names to the community of promise advisory council 113 county board of supervisors for confirmation. In the event that an insufficient
- 114 number of applications are received, the remainder of the commission shall be 115 jointly appointed by the county executive and county board chairperson and confirmed by the community of promise advisory council county board of 116
- 117 supervisors.
- 118 (3) Qualifications. At the time of selection, commissioners shall be a resident of 119 Milwaukee County, and shall: 120
 - (a) Have achieved high school status;
 - (b) Currently attend high school or alternative school or demonstrate the intent to attend a high school or alternative school; and or
 - (c) Have met other qualification criteria as established by the commission under 106.04.

- (a) At least 1 commissioner per supervisory district
- (b) county board chairperson appointee will serve as co-chair

- (2) *Terms* Of the adult advisors appointed to serve the first commission, one
 appointed by the chairman chairperson of the county board and one

- 189 (3) *Duties* Adult advisors shall assist in coordinating all training for the youth
 190 commission. Adult advisors shall attend meetings of the commission as well as
 191 meetings of the committees to which they are assigned. Adult advisors have no
 192 voting privileges and serve only in an advisory capacity.
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SECTION 6. Section 106.08 of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is
 hereby amended as follows:

197 **106.08. - Length of term.**

Of the commissioners selected by the initial review panel under [section] 106.03,
 half, or the best approximation thereof, shall be appointed to terms that end January 1,
 2004 2024 and the balance shall be appointed to terms that end January 1, 2005 2025.
 Commissioners selected to serve on subsequent commissions on youth shall serve <u>a</u>
 maximum of (2) two-year terms.

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SECTION 7. Section 106.09 of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is
 hereby amended as follows:

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207 **106.09. - Open meetings.**

All business meetings of the commission and its consulting committees shall be publicly held and open to all citizens at all times as required by s19.81 et seq., Wis. Statutes. <u>The commission may convene and meet to conduct business remotely</u>

- 211 via telephone conference, video conference or other electronic communication
- 212 provided that the meeting is live streamed, televised live or otherwise broadcast
- 213 live to the public.
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SECTION 8. Section 106.10 of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is
 hereby amended as follows:

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218 **106.10. - Cooperation.**

The county board shall provide for meeting rooms as may be required for the conduct of commission business. All departments and divisions of county government shall assist with and support the activities of the commission. <u>The county clerk shall</u> <u>provide staffing assistance to the commission and ensure facilitation of its</u> <u>meetings and adherence to open meeting requirements.</u>

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SECTION 9. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective upon passage andpublication.

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
