REQUEST

The Project Management Office within the Office of Strategy, Budget & Performance is pleased to share an analysis of grant development activity that took place across Milwaukee County in Fiscal Year 2021.

POLICY

The Grants and Special Projects Division of the Department of Administrative Services was created in July 2020 by County Board File 20-534.

BACKGROUND

The Grants and Special Projects Division of the Department of Administrative Services launched in December 2020 with the hiring of two positions: Grants & Special Projects Director and Senior Grants Analyst. The Senior Special Projects Analyst was hired in March of 2021 to complete the unit. These three positioned worked to support grant development across Milwaukee County using a launch action plan and a structured framework for providing grant support.

Launching Grant Support

The Grants & Special Projects (GSP) Division focused its inaugural year on initiating systems and processes to enhance Milwaukee County's ability to compete in grant contests and implement projects. The GSP Division established the mission to amplify current grant efforts within Milwaukee County and provide targeted grant development support to increase success and ensure grant and special projects move Milwaukee County forward in achieving racial and health equity. The division has been working towards foundational goals to:

Establish model grant development systems in Milwaukee County.
 Function A: Track, monitor and report Milwaukee County competitive grant application activity

Function B: Uphold grant development and application best practices

2. Increase the capacity of County departments to compete for grant revenue.

Function C: Maintain a toolbox of grant resources

Function D: Facilitate professional development to build staff capacity

3. Cultivate grant and special project activity across Milwaukee County in 2021.

Function E: Conduct grant searches

Function F: Facilitate and support the work of grant development teams following tiered model

Function G: Guide the grant acceptance process

Function H: Support post-award grant and special project activities and monitoring

Operationalizing Grant Processes

Within its first six months, the division established two processes for the Administrative Manual of Operating Procedures (AMOPs) focused on tracking and establishing a system to effectively support grant writing efforts of county offices and departments. AMOP 11.01: Grant Intent Notification allows the County to quantify competitive grant activity across the organization to gauge success and pursuit of new grant funds. The County also adopted AMOP 11.02: Grant System of Support which provides a tiered structure for effectively supporting departments with grant writing. Lastly, the division organized AMOP 11.03: Competitive Grant Agreement Review & Approval to support onboarding of new grant awards.

Cultivating Grant Development

In 2021, Milwaukee County applied for 51 competitive grants totaling \$122,775,023 in requests. Grants ranged in size from \$2,750 to \$32,738,900, across nine departments. As of May 1, 2022, 34 proposals have been accepted, 12 denied, and 5 are pending. In total, Milwaukee County has secured \$41,675,339 in revenue from state, federal, and private sources. Please see Appendix B: Grant Development Overview 2021 Report for further details on 2021 grant activity.

This activity represents the work of nine different departments and dozens of subject matter project teams. Departments were supported at varying intensities dependent upon service area needs, using the Grant System of Support. This collaborative approach supported the County's success in pursuing and securing new revenue at a time when resources are most needed in the community.

The division also helped solicit federal earmarks, seek reimbursement of pandemicrelated expenses through Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and project manage Milwaukee County's \$183M American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) aid.

Aligning Services with Strategy & Project Management

As of January 2022, this division is now embedded within the Project Management Office (PMO) and is part of the new Office of Strategy, Budget & Performance. Staff

from this area work with departments to identify, apply for, and track grants from the county's state, federal, and private partners.

PMO resources will be focused on operationalizing grant development and planning strategies in 2022. This includes working closely will colleague departments to establish "plans on a shelf" which includes defining the department's strategic priorities, identifying resource gaps, and targeting revenue opportunities that can further those initiatives.

Additionally, for Milwaukee County to be increasingly successful in securing new grant revenue, we must increase the grant writing and project management capacity of our workforce. To do this, the PMO will maintain a grant writing toolbox and library of resources on CountyConnect. Grant staff will also offer virtual grant writing workshops to County employees. The content of the toolbox and workshop are based on results from an internal grant writing needs assessment survey disseminated across departments and consultation meetings with program areas.

ALIGNMENT TO STRATEGIC PLAN

The grant unit seeks to increase the County's grant writing capacity, contribute to existing grant writing efforts, diversify funding opportunities pursued and maximized the County's competitiveness for funding. The grant development system of support AMOP has been adopted by the Fiscal Health (3B) Strategy Team as a strategy to support the financial position of Milwaukee County.

The office also intentionally structures grant and special project systems, processes, and practices in ways that are intended to advance Milwaukee County's strategic objectives 2A, 3A and 3C. The grant writing capacity added by the office can support the advancement of strategic initiatives through new grant funds. Grant-funded projects impact numerous strategic objectives.

2A: Determine what, where, and how we deliver services to advance health equity

3A: Invest "upstream" to address root causes of health disparities

3B: Enhance the County's fiscal health and sustainability

3C: Dismantle barriers to diverse and inclusive communities

FISCAL EFFECT

In 2021, the Milwaukee County applied for 51 competitive grants across all departments. Grants ranged in size from \$2,750 to \$32,738,900, across nine departments. As one can imagine the grant approval process can take time, therefore, as of May 1, 2022, 34 proposals have been accepted, 12 denied, and 5 are still pending. In total, Milwaukee County has secured \$41,675,339 in revenue from state, federal, and a few private grants.

APPENDIX A

GRANTS & SPECIAL PROJECTS OVERVIEW

Division Mission Statement

The Division of Grants & Special Projects will amplify current grant efforts within Milwaukee County and provide targeted grant development support to increase success and ensure grant and special projects move Milwaukee County forward in achieving racial equity and becoming the healthiest county in Wisconsin.

Division Core Functions

The Division of Grants & Special Projects will provide leadership and coordination within Milwaukee County on competitive grant proposal, implementation and monitoring activities. By deploying intentional systems of support, the division seeks to increase the County's grant writing capacity, contribute to existing grant writing efforts, diversify funding opportunities pursued and maximize the County's competitiveness for funding. The division will also support implementation of grant and special projects to ensure efficacy and impactful outcomes that benefit the function of Milwaukee County. To fulfill this work under the County Executive and Department of Administrative Services, division staff will create effective systems to:

- research and disseminate discretionary grant opportunities aligned with County priorities
- track county-wide grant application activity
- facilitate the work of grant development teams and decision-making processes
- create a grant writing toolbox and library of resources for County staff
- provide timelines, templates and technical support for grant writing
- control use of DUNs numbers and other organizational identifiers
- provide guidance for the acceptance, launch and implementation of grants and special projects
- manage a central repository of grant proposal files, login credentials and contact information
- support submittal of required program reports requested by funders
- facilitate on-demand and in-person professional development to build grant writing capacity
- monitor the status of proposals and report awards to County leadership and Board of Supervisors
- collaborate across county departments and divisions to troubleshoot grant and special projects, and
- support County strategic plan initiatives.

These efforts will position Milwaukee County to 1) be highly competitive in grant contests and 2) maximize the impact and effectiveness of grant funds and special projects.

GRANT DEVELOPMENT OVERVIEW

QUICK FACTS

COMPETITIVE GRANTS

In 2021 Milwaukee County applied for **51 competitive grants** across all departments for a total of **\$122,775,023** requested dollars.

The division provided **34 projects** at the Tier One level of support, seven projects at the Tier Two level of support, and **10 projects** at Tier Three level of support.

These quick facts represent the collaborative work of **nine Milwaukee County** departments and dozens of subject matter project teams who focused their efforts to secure additional revenue and resource for Milwaukee County.

- Research and disseminate discretionary grant opportunities aligned with Milwaukee County priorities.
- Facilitate the work of grant development teams and decision-making processes.
- Create a grant writing toolbox and library of resources for Milwaukee County staff.
- Provide timelines, templates, and technical support for grant writing.
- Collaborate across county departments and divisions to troubleshoot grant projects.

Grant Development Activity Overview

In 2021 Milwaukee County applied for 51 competitive grants across all departments for a total of \$122,775,023 requested dollars. Grants ranged in size from \$2,750 to \$32,738,900 across nine departments. As of May 1, 2022, 34 proposals have been accepted, 12 denied, and five are pending. In total, Milwaukee County has secured \$41,675,339 in revenue from state, federal, and a few private grants.

Strategic Focus Areas

Grant proposals submitted by Milwaukee County departments algin with the three strategic pillars outlined in the County's strategic plan, and in many cases support more than one strategic focus:


Bridge the Gap — Determine what, where, and how we deliver services based on the resolution of health disparities, break down silos across county government to maximize access to and quality of services offered, and apply a racial equity lens to all decisions (27 projects).

Create Intentional Inclusion — reflect the full diversity of Milwaukee County at every level of county government, create and nurture an inclusive culture across the county, increase the number of county contracts awarded to minority and women-owned businesses (14 projects).

Invest in Equity — Invest upstream to address root causes of health disparities, enhance the Milwaukee County's fiscal health and sustainability, and dismantle barriers to diverse and inclusive communities (35 projects).

Tiers of Support

The GSP provides grant development support to Milwaukee County departments based on a tiered structure of support. Tier One, known as universal support, is provided to all



departments. For Tier Two, collaborative support, GSP staff play a participatory role throughout the development process to meet the needs of the project team as an optional resource. Tier Three, lead support, occurs when GSP staff play a lead role throughout the development process to meet the needs of the project team as a requested resource.

The analysis of 2021 proposal found the GSP provided 34 projects at the Tier One level of support, seven projects at the Tier Two level of support, and 10 projects at Tier Three level of support. The level of support needed from the GSP is reflected in the size of the department, the capacity of department staff to search, write and submit grants, and often the level of collaboration between departments on project proposals. For example, the House of Correction (HOC) received a \$750,000 award to provide case management services to incarcerated parents. This was the HOC's first grant award in recent years. HOC leaders partnered with the GSP and received Tier Three support.

Conversely, the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) has exceptional experience and success writing and submitting grants internally. The GSP provided Tier One support for 16 out of the 26 competitive proposals DHHS submitted in 2021.

Funding Sources

Proposals submitted by Milwaukee County departments were from four types of funding sources: federal (\$96,855,256),

GRANT DEVELOPMENT TIERS OF SUPPORT

Tier One Services

- Conduct daily, weekly, and monthly grant searches based on need and funding source.
- Provide consultation on the project idea and funder guidelines.
- Review and provide feedback on grant application.

Tier Two Services

- Facilitate grant development meeting with partner and stakeholder (assign roles, determine meeting cadence, and create project timeline).
- Assist with writing, researching and/or analyzing data for sections of the application.

Tier Three Services

All Tier Two services and:

- Lead proposal writing.
- Facilitate multi-department grant development meeting and ensure task completion by group members.




state (\$24,105,997), private/partner (\$1,813,771). In addition, 29 projects were new funding opportunities that Milwaukee County had not pursued in that past, totaling \$111,735,087 in requests (four significant projects are still pending).

Nine County departments submitted grant proposals in 2021. DHHS submitted 26 grant proposals totaling \$40,009,812 in requested revenue. The Parks Department also submitted a significant number of proposals totaling \$6,890,317. Other department such as the Zoo, House of Correction, Department of Transportation, Courts, Department of Administrative Services, and Office of African American Affairs (now Office on Equity) also submitted proposals in 2021.

Outcome

Overall, Milwaukee County, in partnership with the GSP. has had significant success with grant development and securing additional resources that provide vital programing and services to our community. In 2021, 51 proposals were submitted by nine Milwaukee County departments. As of May 1, 2022. Milwaukee County has secured \$41,675,339 in revenue from 34 state, federal and a few private/ partner grants. It is important to note that five significant proposals requesting \$61,188,295 in grant revenue are still pending, and 12 proposals requesting \$19,911,389 have been denied. Across Milwaukee County, proposal success remains high.





SAMPLE PROJECTS

TIER ONE

Department of Health and Human Services Behavioral Health Services

Greater Milwaukee Foundation

\$42,866 AWARDED COVID-19 TELEHEALTH AND CONNECTIVITY FUNDING will allow Milwaukee County Behavioral Health Services to facilitate access to telehealth services for individuals with severe mental illness, high utilization rates of acute adult inpatient services, and under Wisconsin Statute 51.20 involuntary commitment for treatment. The target population are 30 individuals participating in the Assisted Outpatient Treatment Program funded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to enhance crisis treatment services for individuals unable to adhere to treatment and who cycle repeatedly from tenuous stability to psychiatric crisis. While telehealth has been a critical factor in helping behavioral health care address the COVID-19 pandemic that continues to have a devastating impact on the health of Milwaukee County residents, federal and/or state funds cannot be used to purchase devices for consumer use. Funding is also requested to collaborate on placement of phone-charging stations in community-based locations for use by consumers seeking primary care, behavioral health care, and crisis care.

TIER TWO

Milwaukee County Zoo Tourism Capital Grant, State ARPA Funding

\$3,500,000 AWARDED ORIGINALLY DESIGNED IN THE 1980S, the Humboldt Penguin exhibit is viewable during all four seasons and welcomes guests upon arrival as the first animal habitat encountered when entering Milwaukee County Zoo grounds. The goal of the Humboldt Penguin exhibit project is to create an engaging, educational, and entertaining zoo entrance experience that inspires connection to nature and increases attendance and local tourism. This exhibit provides an opportunity to engage with this charismatic penguin species (and their zookeepers) and fulfill Milwaukee County Zoo's mission to "inspire public understanding, support, and participation in global conservation of animal species." The Humboldt Penguin exhibit is also the site of one of the Milwaukee County Zoo's most popular animal experience tours, "Wild Connections," which "meets" or "exceeds [the] expectations" of 97% of survey respondents.

TIER THREE

House of Correction,
Office of Juvenile Justice and
Delinquency Prevention

FY2021 Second Chance Act
Addressing the Needs of
Incarcerated Parents
and Their Minor Children

\$750,000 AWARDED

THE MILWAUKEE COUNTY HOUSE OF CORRECTION (HOC) proposes to develop and deliver a family centric program (FAM) to provide a safe, supportive environment for incarcerated parents to strengthen their relationships with their children. The FAM Services Program will design and open HOC child-friendly spaces for children who are visiting their incarcerated parents. Parallel to these facility changes, safety protocols and procedures will be integrated with a coordinated system of programs and services to support the needs of 50 incarcerated parents and their minor children. The services are designed to prevent violent crime, reduce recidivism and provide support for the children. The evidence-based services include effective parenting skills development, parent/child relationship engagement, healthy relationship education, family mediation, literacy education, college preparation and holistic family case management. FAM services also incorporate reentry and transitional services that focus on parental responsibility, including housing, nutrition, clothing, health insurance and legal. FAM builds on strong existing partnerships with the State of Wisconsin Department of Children and Families, Milwaukee Child Protective Services, Milwaukee County Youth and Family Services, The Center for Self-Sufficiency, University of Wisconsin Milwaukee Talent Search Program and University of Wisconsin Madison Division of Extension the Literacy Link.

Grant staff lead the development of the grant application from start to finish under the content expertise of the involved department(s). Staff may write narrative, develop budgets, research strategies, submit the proposal, and facilitate multi-department meetings and timelines.






Proposal Overview

Status of Funding Sources for 2021 Grants





Number of Projects Supported by Tier










Status of 2021 Submitted Proposals


