Credible Messenger Program	This program identifies high-risk youth, ages 17-24, at the center of gun violence, provides them with seven-days-a-week mentoring and supportive relationships using credible messengers and delivers services and supports for a minimum of 1-year.	\$1,201,200
Trauma Response Program	Fund additional community crisis beds to assist with non-police responses to crisis calls. Funding would be used to fund the emergency beds/housing options as well as crisis response staff.	\$1,971,200
Emergency Health & Healing Campaign	Public awareness campaign for mental health services available. The campaign will promote and increase awareness about non-law enforcement related and preventative/upstream services in BHD and No Wrong Door (Children's & Adult Integration projects). Increased awareness continues to be a need as mental health and public safety issues increase in the pandemic.	\$545,600
Safer Milwaukee Proposal	Support for non-law enforcement crisis response. These efforts would increase support for mental health and public safety priorities.	\$550,000
