The Project Management Office reviews project ideas for alignment with allowable ARPA uses Subgroup members use criteria to review and score Project Proposals to form a funding recommendation for the service area

ARPA Community Support funding recommendations will be presented to the ARPA Task Force for adoption

Allowable projects are dispatched to the appropriate service area subgroup for review and consideration

Subgroups request that high priority project ideas be developed into a full ARPA Project Proposal for funding consideration Upon ARPA Task Force recommendation, departments request fund authorization through the County Board process
