County Ordinance No. 22-7 File No. 22-358

#### AN ORDINANCE

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Milwaukee does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 69 of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

Section 69.02. - Parking prohibited in designated areas.

No person shall stop or leave any vehicle standing in any of the following places, except temporarily, for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading or in receiving or discharging passengers and while the vehicle is attended by a licensed operator:

- (1) College Avenue (C.T.H. 'ZZ')
  - (a) Between the limits of South 20th Street and South 27th Street.
  - (b) On the south side, from a point four hundred fifty (450) feet east of South 35th Street to the limits of South 27th Street.
- (2) South 76th Street (C.T.H. 'U')
  - (a) Between the limits of West Grange Avenue and West Layton Avenue.
  - (b) Between the limits of West Ryan Road and a point three-fourths (¾) of a mile north of Ryan Road.
  - (c) Along the west side of South 76th Street (C.T.H. U) from a point six hundred fifty (650) feet south of the south line of West Ryan Road to a point nine hundred seventy-five (975) feet south of the south line of West Ryan Road.
  - (d) Along the west side of South 76th Street (C.T.H. U) from a point one thousand seventy-five (1,075) feet south of the south line of West Ryan Road to a point one thousand two hundred (1,200) feet south of the south line of West Ryan Road.
- (3) Good Hope Road (C.T.H. 'PP')
  - (a) Between the limits of North Port Washington Road and North Pierron Road.
- (4) South 68th Street (C.T.H. 'A')
  (a) Between the limits of West Ryan Road and a point three-fourths (¾) of a mile north of Rvan Road.
- (5) West Beloit Road (C.T.H. 'T')
  - (a) North side of the road from the intersection of South 108th Street (S.T.H. 100) to a point five hundred seventy (570) feet east of South 108th Street
  - (b) On both sides of the street from 100 feet east to 100 feet west of the Root River Oak Leaf Trail Crosswalk east of West Howard Avenue.
- (6) West Layton Avenue (C.T.H. 'Y')
  - (a) From the limits of South 60th Street to a point eight hundred twenty-five (825) feet east of South 60th Street.
  - (b) On the south side of the street from the limits of South 49th Street to the limits of South 48th Street.
- (7) South 92nd Street (C.T.H. 'N')
  - (a) On the west side of the street from the limits of West Howard Avenue to the limits of West Waterford Avenue

SECTION 2. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication.

County Ordinance No. 22-6 File No. 22-467

#### AN ORDINANCE

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Milwaukee does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 17.177 of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is hereby created as follows:

#### 17.177 - Paid parental leave.

- (1) All employees with a defined work week of twenty (20) hours or more shall be entitled to up to eight (8) weeks of paid parental leave for any qualifying event once every calendar year, subject to the following:
  - a. Employees with a defined work week of forty (40) hours shall be entitled to 320 hours of paid parental leave for a qualifying event; all other employees shall be entitled to a paid parental leave for a qualifying event prorated based on their defined work week. For example, an employee with a defined work week of twenty (20) hours would be entitled to 160 hours of paid parental leave, or eight (8) weeks of leave based on their defined work week.
  - Only qualifying events on or after June 6, 2022, shall be eligible for paid parental leave.
  - c. An employee with a defined work week of forty (40) hours shall have worked a minimum of 1,000 hours in the 12 months prior to the qualifying event. The minimum number of hours worked in the 12 months prior for an employee with a defined work week of at least twenty (20) hours but less than forty (40) hours shall be a prorated amount of the forty (40) hour defined work week.
  - d. Paid parental leave shall run concurrently with any state or federal family leave for which the employee may be eligible.
  - An employee with a qualifying event under this section who does not qualify for protection under the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) of 1993 shall be provided the same job protections specified by the act.
  - The leave may be continuous, or intermittent with the approval of the appointing authority, but must be used within one (1) year of the qualifying event.
  - g. If a paid parental leave coincides with a paid holiday, the employee shall be given holiday pay in ileu of parental leave.
- (2) An eligible employee shall be eligible for up to eight (8) weeks of paid parental leave once per catendar year, after any of the following qualifying events:
  - a. Birth of a child.
  - Placement of a child under the age of five (5) through adoption, fostering, guardianship, or acting in place of a parent.
- (3) An eligible employee who is also a birthing parent may qualify for paid parental leave, prorated based on their defined work week, in the following special circumstances:
  - A birthing parent who experiences a miscarriage or stillbirth shall be eligible for up to three (3) weeks of paid parental leave.
  - A birthing parent who experiences incapacity related to pregnancy or serious health conditions following the birth of a child shall be eligible for up to two (2) weeks of paid parental leave in addition to the eight (8) weeks of paid parental leave.

SECTION 2. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication.
