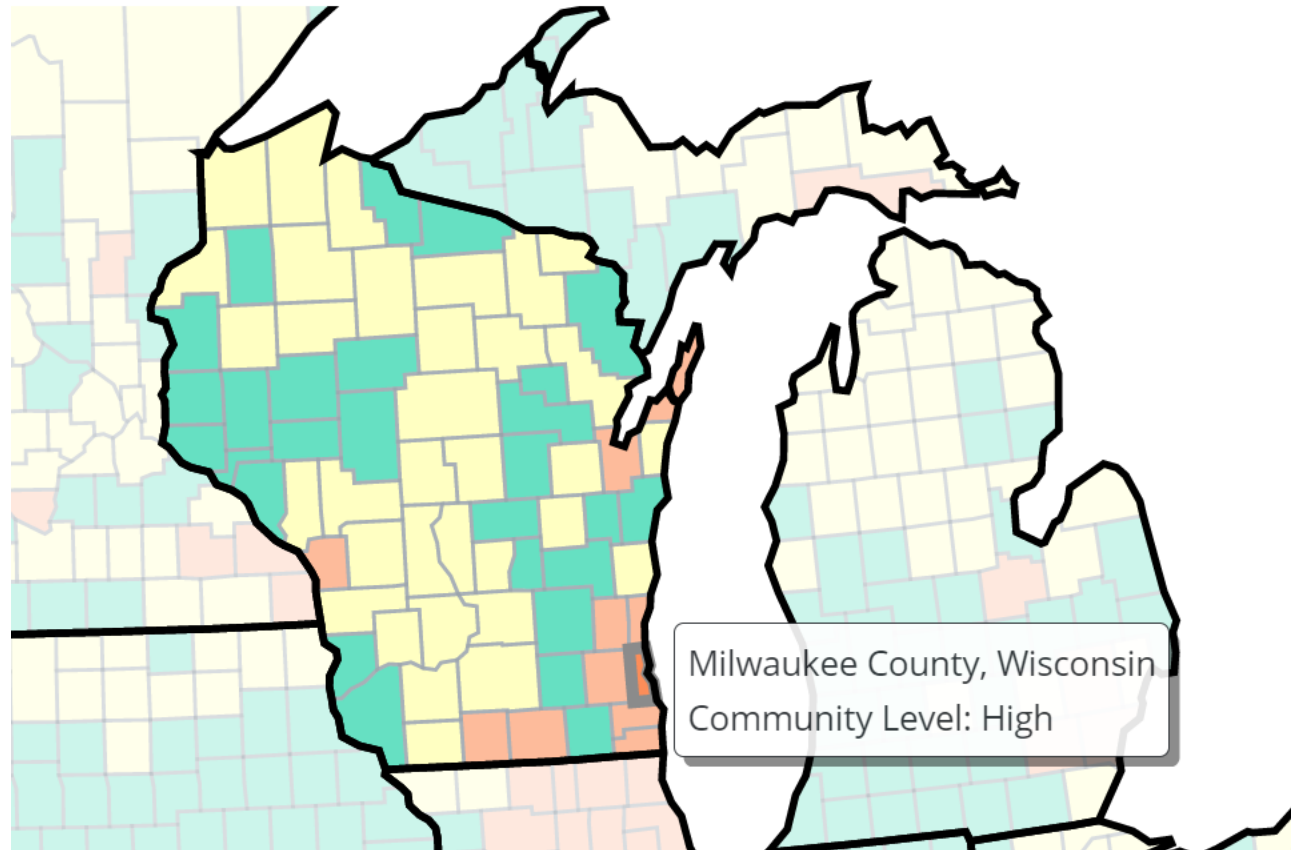

- New Admissions Rate = 10.4
- Hospital Capacity = 4.3%
- Case Rate = 285.7
- Milwaukee County remains classified as “High”

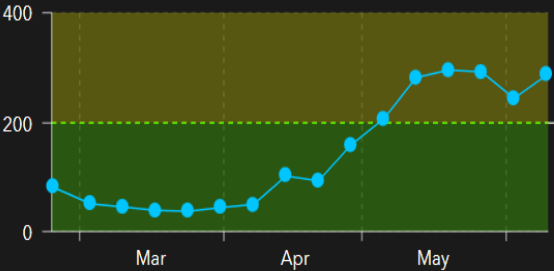

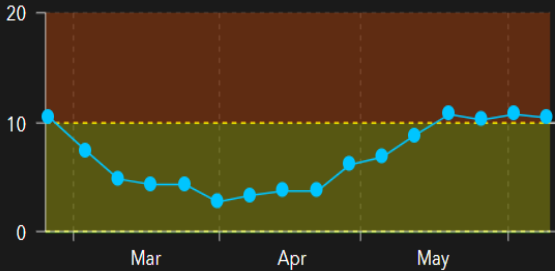

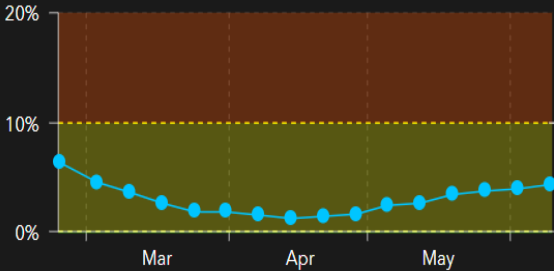
COVID Cases per 100k

Recent Changes – Implemented May 20

Milwaukee County's CDC community risk level changed to "high" on May 19 prompting the following changes:

- Updated masking guidelines to "high"
 - Most areas that were "no mask required" became "mask required"
- Updated capacity guidelines to "high"
 - Reimplemented COVID screening survey for employees
 - Encourage telework when possible
 - Limit unnecessary in-person indoor gatherings



In Process Actions

Booster Awareness Communications

- Partnering with Dr. Weston and the County's Communications Team to launch an employee awareness campaign on the importance of obtaining the booster vaccination

COVID Recognition Program

- Nominations of individuals, teams and departments who have done an outstanding job protecting our employees, and the people we serve



Next Steps

- Continue to closely monitor Milwaukee County COVID-19 levels
- Take the appropriate action, in consultation with and under the advisement of Dr. Weston, Chief Health Policy Advisor
- Provide ongoing reporting and updates to the Board of Supervisors
