9	M/HEDEAS. Title III of the Older Americana Act (OAA) provides for grants to
10 11	WHEREAS, Title III of the Older Americans Act (OAA) provides for grants to State and area agencies on aging to stimulate the development of comprehensive and
12	coordinated community-based systems resulting in a continuum of services for older
13	adults and, per Federal regulations, OAA funding must be spent on services that assist
14	older adults with the greatest economic and social need with particular attention to
15	people of color; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, in March 2021, President Biden signed into law the American
18	Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), which provided states with over \$1.4 billion in OAA funding to
19	allocate to local area agencies on aging; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, through its ARPA allocation, the State of Wisconsin (the State)
22	Department of Health Services (DHS) has allocated \$2,051,430 in OAA funding (with a
23	required match of \$300,513) to the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS);
24	and

26	WHEREAS, on February 3, 2022, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors
27	(County Board) authorized DHHS to contract with the State, and to accept \$2,051,430
28	in OAA funds as provided through ARPA (Public Law No: 117-2); and
29	WHEREAS DHHS is currently working with its sylicting vender pertoase and
30 31	WHEREAS, DHHS is currently working with its existing vendor partners and other potential vendors to explore to what extent match requirements can be contributed
31 32	by these organizations; and
33	by these organizations, and
34	WHEREAS, most of the vendors that are currently contracted to provide aging
35	services, as well as some potential vendors that DHHS is recruiting to spend down
36	ARPA/OAA dollars, are small nonprofit or private sector organizations that may not be
37	able to contribute any match; and

39	WHEREAS, the ability to utilize contingency funding to cover the required match
40	would enable DHHS staff to recruit a diverse array of organizations with which to
41	partner to spend down its ARPA/OAA allocation; and
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43	WHEREAS, DHHS staff is working collaboratively with the Commission on Aging
44	and older adults in the County, to determine the best use of the OAA dollars provided
45	through the ARPA legislation; and
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WHEREAS, DHHS staff and the Commission on Aging is using its 2022-2024
Area Aging Plan as a starting point for discussions on the best use of ARPA/OAA
dollars; and

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51 WHEREAS, per Section 53.09 of the Milwaukee County Code of General 52 Ordinances, where applicable, some contract recommendations from the Commission 53 on Aging that utilize ARPA/OAA funding may need to be submitted to the County Board 54 for review and approval; and
