47 48 49	SECTION 1 . Section 47.08 of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is hereby amended as follows:

55 54 55 56 57 58 59 60	(a) No person shall climb any tree, or pluck any flowers or fruit, wild or cultivated, or break, cut down, trample upon, remove, or in any manner <u>damage</u> , injure or deface, write upon, defile or ill use any tree, shrub, flower, flower bed, turf, fountain, ornament, play structure, statue, building, fence, apparatus equipment, bench, table, official notice, sign, bridge, structure or other property within any park or parkway the Park System.

68 69 70 71 72 73 74	(a) No person shall harvest, collect, deface, or disturb, in any manner, any portion of a native plant or native fungi within the Park System. Exceptions are made for DPRC staff, and individuals, groups, or entities authorized, through written permission from the DPRC, who are conducting land management or scientific research activities for ecological restoration, trail maintenance, or public safety.
75 76 77 78 79 80 81	(b) The removal of species within the Park System that the DPRC designates as invasive species can be removed or controlled by DPRC staff or individuals, groups, or entities authorized through written permission from the DPRC. Planting of any vegetative material within the Park System without the written permission of the DPRC is prohibited.
82 83 84 85 86 87 88 88 89 90	(c) The harassment, capture, injury, or killing of native wildlife within the Park System is prohibited. Exceptions are made for DPRC staff or individuals, groups, or entities authorized, through written permission from the DPRC, to disperse, remove, or reduce populations of wildlife that have become a detriment to public safety, public health, or the ecological integrity of the Park System's natural areas. Introduction or release of any animal, wild or domestic, within the Park System without the written permission of the DPRC is prohibited.
90 91 92	(d) Natural areas within the Park System that are designated by the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (SEWRPC) as

93	Natural Areas of Local, Regional, or State-wide Significance or
94	designated as Critical Species Habitat Areas, will receive a heightened
95	level of protection. Allowable activities within these designated areas
96	include: hiking, biking, or running on DPRC designated trails only,
97	nature study, bird watching, or other similar passive recreation
98	activities designated by the DPRC. The DPRC or individuals, groups, or
99	entities authorized, through written permission from the DPRC, are

107	or lake within any park or parkway, nor remove any sand therefrom, or from
108	the shores thereof, without a written permit of the park commission.
109	Exceptions are made for DPRC staff or individuals, groups, or entities
110	<u>authorized, through written permission from the DPRC, to remove or</u>
111	deposit these materials for land management or public safety reasons.

113	(3) Reward. Any person who shall give information to the district attorney of
114	the county, or to the sheriff, deputy sheriff, or to any law enforcement
115	officer of said county, leading to the apprehension, arrest and conviction of
116	any person(s) personally observed by him/her to have caused injury to,
117	destroyed or removed any public property, as stated under subsections (1)
118	and (2) hereof, shall be paid a reward of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

120	(4) Penalties. For any individual, group, or entity violating any component of
121	<u>Ordinance 47.08 a minimum fee fine of \$100 will be levied for each violation</u>
122	<u>and the responsible party will also be required to pay 100% of all ecological</u>
123	restoration costs associated with mitigating the damage the DPRC
124	determines has been done to the Park System's natural resources.
