From the Executive Director of Parks providing an information report on the withdrawal of the National Park Service Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program Grant application by Milwaukee County Parks.

BACKGROUND

In 2021, Milwaukee County Parks requested authorization via File #21-921 to apply for the National Park Service Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program Grant (NPS ORLP) to improve trail equity and expand trails in underserved neighborhoods. Milwaukee County Parks proposed to utilize work planned by MMSD to remove the concrete channel from the Kinnickinnic river as a match. During an administrative review after a tentative award for 50% of trail costs (\$453,954) from the NPS ORLP program, it was determined that the grant timeline and the larger MMSD project timeline did not align. The grant application was subsequently withdrawn to free up the funding for other NPS projects. Parks and MMSD are still planning to coordinate on the construction of an off-road portion of the Oak Leaf Trail from Pulaski Park to 27th Street in the coming years.

Milwaukee County Parks appreciates the National Park Service's focus on investing in underserved and low-income areas and hopes to access these funds in the future. The project scored well and withdrawing the grant does not prejudice against future applications. At the recommendation of NPS ORLPP staff, MCP will likely apply again and continue to pursue diverse funding streams including over 5 million dollars in other federal trail grants currently under review by various agencies.
