#### BACKGROUND

On March 15, 2022, Governor Tony Evers announced that he was directing a \$14,586,230 award to Milwaukee County and its criminal justice system to address the backlog of criminal court cases created by the pandemic, based on the court. Of that sum, \$5,627,902 was identified for the benefit of the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office, for costs related to additional attorney and support staff positions.

On 3/24/22 the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors Adopted Resolution 22-476 and on 4/4/22 it was signed by the County Executive recognizing, accepting, and

appropriating ARPA Funds from the State of Wisconsin for purposes of expanding court operations, enhancing pretrial services, and increasing House of Corrections programming.

#### FISCAL EFFECT

The funding for the 19 positions will come from the District Attorney's allotment of \$5,627,902 with \$2,966,202.42 designated specifically for the costs related to county positions in the District Attorney's Office.

The ARPA project is projected to extend from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2024.

The District Attorney's Office anticipates hiring for the new ARPA created County positions beginning in August of 2022.
